When we hear the word "thanksgiving," we think of November, leafless trees and lifeless fields, first snows and falling temperatures, family gatherings and food-filled tables, conversations and confrontations. In the United States, the fourth Thursday of November has been declared A National Day of Thanksgiving.

But the Church has its own calendar. And while our congregation celebrates A National Day of Thanksgiving, the Church has its own Thanksgiving Days. In fact, almost every Sunday is Thanksgiving Day at Trinity.

Most Sundays our congregation gathers for the Eucharist—what we call the Lord's Supper. Eucharist is the Greek word meaning "thanksgiving." Every Eucharist, every Lord's Supper, is a thanksgiving meal.

Just as Jesus gave thanks at the Last Supper which became the first Lord's Supper; so, every time we do what Jesus told us to do; every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper; every time we eat the bread and drink the cup; we give thanks.

It's all over The Services of the Sacrament in our hymnal. Listen for it! The Preface and the Proper Preface of each Divine Service setting begins with these words chanted by the pastor, "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God," and "It is truly good, right, and salutary, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks to You, holy Lord, almighty Father, everlasting God..."

Divine Service, Settings One and Two, have a Prayer of Thanksgiving and provide the option of singing "Thank the Lord" as the Post-Communion Canticle.

Divine Service, Setting Three, includes a Thanksgiving after the distribution that quotes Psalm 136:1, "O give thanks unto the

LORD for He is good, and His mercy endureth forever."

The Prayer of Thanksgiving from Divine Service, Setting Four puts these words in our ears, "We give You thanks for the redemption You have prepared for us through Jesus Christ."

All of the Divine Services give the option of praying the Post-Communion Collect that Luther penned for his German Mass, "We give thanks to You almighty God, that You have refreshed us through this salutary gift..."

For the Church, for our congregation, for us as individual believers, giving thanks is not a once-a-year, every-now-and-then thing. It is an every-week, every-Lord's-Day, all-yearlong thing. Every Sunday is Thanksgiving Day! Every Lord's Supper is a Thanksgiving meal!

Why? Because, Jesus is the same, yesterday, today, and forever (Hebrews 13:8). Because, His steadfast love never ceases, His mercies never come to an end (Lamentation 3:22). Because, His redemption is a plentiful redemption (Psalm 130:6) and an eternal redemption (Hebrews 9:12).

You may not think you have much to be thankful for this Thanksgiving Day. You're older. You're poorer. Your troubles have increased and your health has declined. Maybe there's an empty chair around the holiday table.

But Jesus, His redemption, His Spirit, His forgiveness, His means of grace, His presence now and His promised return—those are reasons to, as St. Paul writes in 2 Thessalonians 3:18, "Give thanks in all circumstances. For this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." Happy Thanksgiving—this November, all year long, and forevermore!

A VOICE FROM THE PAST

In this prayer penned by Johann Gerhard in 1629, he gets lost in thanksgiving to God for all of His good gifts:

How generous You are to the whole human race, O God! You once created all things for the use of men. You preserve all things yet today for the sake of men. Whatever You provide for creation, You provide for me, because for my sake You wonderfully formed, established and preserve all these things.


Mites -


