Forgive me, but sometimes I read things that I just have to share with the congregation (or, at least those who bother to read the newsletter). Pastor Adam Koontz's outstanding article in the March Lutheran Witness is one of those things. The article is titled, "Quiet Despair and Its Remedies."

Pastor Koontz begins the article with these words that express what so many of us have thought or are thinking. He writes:

A sadness pervades the Christian church in our country. We seem to hear what sounds like the trumpet of retreat. All sense that the church's high-water mark was somewhere in the past, and the future is dark and unsure.

But Pastor Koontz doesn't allow us to wallow in our longing for the past, our despair over the present, and our fear of the future. He makes five points—points that I will share with you now, along with a brief comment he makes about each point.

Point #1: Christ is the Head of the Church.

"At the head of every single Christian congregation is a living, triumphant Victor and King...Only He is the conqueror, so only His Word and His will have the say in our lives and in our churches."

Point #2: The Head (Christ) is our hope.

"The more we focus on our uncertainties and fears, the more power they have over us...We know that God's Son is working all things together for our good. The future is an unfolding of Christ's plan and ends with His triumphant return, to which we look forward with love and hope."

Point #3: Our Head (Christ) has a bright future.

"Despair is only possible between Good Friday's darkness and Easter's brilliant light...Our quiet despair is always our forgetfulness of His resurrection and our refusal to see how it changes everything. Since death is behind Him, the whole future is open to Him. And His future is bright."

Point #4: His bright future is ours too.

"Since He is risen, we have not been joined to a body of death, destined to perish, bound to fade away...Christ's church moves always from life to life, alive in Him now and headed for life everlasting."

Point #5: Despair is not your master; Christ is your Lord.

"Christ is not only Lord of the past, reigning over black-and-white photographs of large confirmation classes or happy baptismal parties in churches now closed. Christ is also Lord today and now and always. Think of who in your area needs the hope He brings today...Act on what is always true: He is alive, and heaven is open to all believers in His promise. Our despair is rooted in our forgetfulness of His victorious life; our joy and hope are rooted in our remembrance of this conquering hero...In Him, we more than conquer."

Pastor Koontz's words remind me of two other statements. One by God in Romans 8, "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." The other by Herman Sasse, "...the future of the Church is the future of Jesus Christ. Amen." Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Hallelujah!

A VOICE FROM THE PAST

Herman Sasse, a faithful Lutheran pastor and theologian in 20th century Germany, captures what Easter is all about. He writes:

Not "Jesus lives" but "Jesus is risen" is the real Easter message of the New Testament. Something happened, God did something, something never heard of, something unique...The essential content and heart of Easter is that "Jesus is risen."

To which we say, "He is risen indeed. Hallelujah!"

Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are his: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since *you* belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.
