Many of us watched, live on TV, the attempted assassination of former President Donald J. Trump on Saturday, July 13. If you didn't watch it, you've heard about it. It has dominated the news ever since. Hearings and investigations regarding it are ongoing.

Countless people have commented about it including those present at the Rally who witnessed what happened, anchors on any number of cable news channels, and the parade of speakers who took to the stage at the Republican national convention in July.

A vast majority of those comments included phrases like "the providence of God," "the hand of God," and "Divine intervention."

Many have concluded, and rightly so, that it was Divine intervention that prevented President Trump from being killed. It was the providence of God that he turned his head at just the right moment and in such a way that the bullet only grazed his ear. It was the hand of God that protected him that day.

So what is this thing called providence. It's an old word, one that disappeared for a while but has found a new lease on life since Saturday, July 13. The providence of God is simply the Fatherly care that God shows to everything and everyone He has created. God, in His providence, sustains His creation and preserves all that He has made.

God, in His providence, feeds the birds of the air, clothes the lilies of the field, causes the sun to shine and the rain to fall on the good and evil alike.

It's God's providence that is described when the catechism says that, "He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly divine

goodness and mercy without any merit or worthiness in me."

So, was it God's providence that Donald Trump escaped the assassin's bullet? Yes, it was. Does that mean that he is special? No, it does not. The same providence of God that protected President Trump and preserved his life is the same providence of God that protects us and preserves our lives. And for that, we are thankful—thankful for President Trump's sake, thankful for our sakes.

But what about Corey Comperatore, the man who took at least one of the deadly rounds intended for President Trump? Where was the providence of God for him? It seems as though God withdrew his hand from him and refused to intervene on his behalf.

God works through means--through people and things. It was God's providence that Corey Comperatore's wife and daughters were kept safe precisely because their husband and father blanketed their bodies with his. It was divine intervention and the hand of God that Corey sacrificed himself and was used by God to save his wife and daughter.

Corey, we are told, was a Christian, a believer in Jesus. Because Jesus took a cross for Corey and gave His body into death for him, we trust that Corey is with the Lord in heaven. There God's providence is not necessary, because Corey wants for nothing. There God does not intervene in the face of danger and evil because there is none.

As Christians we give thanks for the providence of God. We recognize His hand and His Divine intervention in our lives and the lives of others. And when it seems to be lacking, we trust our Father who, in His mercy, redeemed us by His Son and adopted us to be His children and heirs of His heaven.

A VOICE FROM THE PAST

Our synod has a shortage of pastors and teachers. In 1905 our synod faced a similar shortage. In response, Franz Pieper, former synodical president, said this:

Our country is a rich land. It is blessed with earthly goods beyond other countries. But we know that through them, no one will be saved. A man may have all of it and still be eternally lost because he does not have the Gospel. Therefore, if we want to exercise true mercy to our country and people, then we must train and send to them teachers and preachers of the Gospel.
