National Lutheran Schools Week is over. Just. But rejoicing and giving thanks for our Lutheran School and all Lutheran schools is something we can do all year long. And not just all school-year long, all 12-months-of-the-year long.

Trip Rodgers, the Central Illinois District Education Executive, sent me an e-mail in January. In it, he asked two questions. "How many students do you have in your school?" Answer, "41." "How many students were baptized last school year through the present school year?" Answer, "7."

Seven baptisms. That's a big deal. But my fear is that we don't fully appreciate what that means. Seven students have been born again as holy children of our heavenly Father. Seven students have been clothed with Christ and His righteousness. Seven children have received the gift of the Holy Spirit who has called them to faith in Jesus and we pray will keep them with Jesus in the true faith. Seven children have entered God's kingdom of grace and have been made heirs having the hope of eternal life.

Every time we see a school student at the font being baptized it reminds us and reinforces for us why we have a school. That is why our congregation and school exists—to make disciples by baptizing them and by teaching them.

Some might say, "But many of those newly baptized students never come to church." Maybe not on Sunday. But every Wednesday they attend our chapel service. In our chapel service we do most of the things we do at a Sunday service. God's Word is read and preached. The creed is confessed. The Lord's prayer and other prayers are prayed. Hymns and parts of the liturgy are sung in

praise to Jesus our Savior, the Father who sent Him, and the Spirit who testifies to Him. We even take an offering and support a variety of missions! For our newly baptized students, Wednesday is their Sunday. It becomes their Lord's Day.

Others might say, "But unless their parents become members, when they leave our school, they'll never be seen again." Maybe, maybe not.

But we have that same problem with families who are members of the congregation. Too many of Trinity's baptized children never get confirmed. Too many who get confirmed don't remain faithful in coming to church, hearing the Word, and receiving the Supper. It's something we all have to guard against.

But consider this, when our baptized students, whose families don't become members, leave our school, they are still baptized. Every promise God made to them in their Baptism remains forever true.

This school year's theme Bible verse is Hebrews 12:2, "Let us run with endurance the race set before us, looking to Jesus, the Founder and Finisher of our faith."

To run the race, you have to be in the race. Baptism, through which faith is FOUNDED in our students' hearts, puts them in the race. The Word of Christ, by which faith comes, empowers them to FINISH that race.

To that end, we should pray for all the children of our congregation, especially our newly baptized students. We must encourage them to run the race set before them with endurance, even as we run that same race alongside them. We should do all we can to help them look to Jesus who alone is the Founder and the Finisher of their faith and ours.

In love, all love excelling, our lost and fallen race.


