October is Pastor Appreciation Month. The fact that I am writing about it may seem a little self-serving. Bear with me. I am not seeking your appreciation. I don't have to. Trinity congregation and her members express their appreciation to me routinely. In all my years of ministry here I have rarely, if ever, felt unappreciated.

But I think it's important for people to know WHY they should appreciate the pastors who serve their congregations and families.

Some people appreciate their pastor because he has a great sense of humor. Some people appreciate their pastor because he's kind. Some people appreciate their pastor because he shares their personal interests or political viewpoints.

There's nothing wrong with a pastor having a sense of humor or being kind. Pastors, like all people, have personal interests and political views. But that's not why parishioners should appreciate their pastors.

1 Thessalonians 5:12-13 sheds light on the matter. It reads, "We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work."

Did you hear that? "Because of their work..." Pastors are to be respected and highly esteemed in love not because of them, or their personalities, or their shared interests and points of view. They are to be respected and highly esteemed in love—appreciated, if you will, because of their work. Because of what they do.

On Sunday, October 27, we will celebrate the Reformation. If we learned anything from the Reformation it is that God does His good and saving work through His

Word and through His promises that He adds to the Sacraments.

The Reformation simply affirmed what the Bible says, that "faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God," that "the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation," that, "the Holy Scriptures are able to make you wise unto salvation through faith in Christ Jesus."

So what is the "work" the pastor does, the "work" for which He is to be appreciated? It is the work of teaching the Word of God and preaching the Gospel. It is the work of administering the Sacraments—baptizing and celebrating the Lord's Supper. It is the work of hearing confessions and speaking the absolution.

Preaching requires a preacher. Teaching requires a teacher. Baptizing requires a baptizer. Celebrating the Lord's Supper requires someone to consecrate and distribute it. Confession requires a confessor to hear the confession and speak the absolution.

Pastors exist for the sake of the means of grace—the means of grace through which the Lord Jesus Himself speaks His Word, forgives and washes away sins, and feeds His people with the body and blood that He gave and shed for them on the cross.

In that way, when you appreciate the pastor because of his work, you are appreciating Jesus who has called him and placed him in the congregation to serve you with the means of grace.

When you respect and highly esteem the pastor because of his work, you are respecting and esteeming Jesus who shepherds His flock through that work. That's why we celebrate Pastor Appreciation Month.

A VOICE FROM THE PAST

CFW Walther, the 1st President of the LCMS, preached these words on Reformation Day, 1861—less than two years before Trinity's founding:

Oh, how we should rejoice today, how we should praise God today, how we should thank Him today, that we by his grace are children of this Reformation and members of the Church resurrected by it! If ever, today we should cry out, "The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy." Yes, today we should forget all the need and misery of our time and let our mouths be filled with laughter and our tongues with praise.

REFORMATION SUNDAY!

- Check out a Luther biography from our church library and read it during the month of October. Roland Bainton's Here I Stand is a classic, while Luther: Biography of a Reformer by Frederick Nohl is a little more accessible. Younger readers might enjoy the graphic novel, Echoes of the Hammer. Pastor Tibben can help you find the books and the videos.
- Make a German meal and enjoy a good beer in honor of Luther and the Reformation.
- Read Luther's 95 Theses, meditate on the words of "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," or use the month of October to review The Small Catechism—just the part that Luther wrote.
- Last, but not least, come to church on Reformation Sunday to hear the preaching
 of the pure Gospel and to receive the Lord's Supper administered according to
 Christ's institution.
- You are a Lutheran! Act like it!




