If you're like me, the first thing you do when you get up in the morning is brew the coffee and turn on the news.

If you did that on New Year's Day, January 1, 2025, you woke up to some very bad news. The New Year began with a terrorist attack in New Orleans. A man driving a pickup truck plowed through a crowd celebrating on Bourbon Street in the wee hours of the morning. As of this writing, 15 are dead and 30-some are injured, many seriously. The death toll is expected to rise.

On New Year's Day a car bomb exploded in front of the Trump motel in Las Vegas. Then, in the evening, there was a mass shooting in Queens, New York.

News like that takes the "Happy" out of "Happy New Year." What we've seen so far is a "Horrific New Year." The idea that 2025 is going to be different, better, more peaceful was shot down right out of the chute. We realize that 2025 is not going to be as "new" as we had hoped. Instead, it appears that it will be more of the same old, same old.

What happened in New Orleans, Las Vegas, and Queens may sadden you, but it should not surprise you. It will only surprise you if you believe that the world and the people who inhabit it are, for the most part, good.

But we know that's not true. This world is sinful. Isaiah on Christmas Eve described it as a "land of deep darkness."

St. Paul, in Romans 3, writes, "There is no one who does good, not even one." We have to stop being surprised by what happened in New Orleans, Las Vegas, and Queens and other things like those. This is the norm for a world steeped in sin and wickedness. This is the norm for hearts that

have been hardened by sin against God and against the neighbor.

Thankfully, we woke up on New Year's Day not only to the first day of a New Year, but to the eighth day of Christmas.

To us who dwell in a land of deep darkness, a light has shined! To us sinners has been born a sinless Savior; a sinless Savior full of grace and truth who went about doing gracious things and speaking the truth.

It's no surprise that on New Year's Eve we heard these words of God from Romans 8, "In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us."

Jesus loved us. Jesus died for us. Jesus rose again and intercedes for us in heaven. We are more than conquerors through Him.

The "these things" that Paul refers to include tribulation, distress, persecution, famine, nakedness, danger and the sword. The "these things" include terrorist attacks like the one in New Orleans and mass shootings like the one in Queens, and all the other evil we encounter in this sinful world and at the hands of sinners.

That may or may not make this year a Happy New Year, but it certainly makes it a Hopeful New Year. Jesus has conquered sin and death and the grave. Believing in Him, baptized into Him, fed by and with Him in His Supper, we share in His victory. We become conquerors, MORE than conquerors through Jesus who loved us.

In Jesus, you can face this New Year whatever happens. In Him you are more than a conqueror whatever happens. In Him you can endure whatever happens. In Him you can help and serve your neighbor whatever happens.

A VOICE FROM THE PAST

At the Divine Service on New Year's Eve we sang the hymn "O Rejoice, Ye Christians, Loudly." Stanza 4 is a wonderful prayer for all of us as we begin this New Year:

Jesus, guard and guide Thy members, fill them with Thy boundless grace,
Hear their prayers in every place.
Fan to flame faith's glowing embers; grant all Christians, far and near,
Holy peace, a glad new year!

2024 AT A GLANCE

At the beginning of a New Year, we reflect on the year just past. We do that as a nation, as families and individuals, and as a congregation. So, here is Trinity's 2024 at a glance.

Average Attendance: 111 members worshipped each Sunday on average in 2024, as compared to 112 in 2023.

Members Added to the Congregation:

- **9 souls** were added to the Holy Christian Church and to our congregation by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.
- 1 soul was received into the Holy Christian Church and to our congregation through adult confirmation and the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.
- 6 souls were received into our congregation by transfer from other LCMS congregations and 1 soul through affirmation of faith.
- All told, 16 souls were added to our congregation in 2024.

Member Subtracted from the Congregation

- **7 souls** were removed from our congregation through death but were received into the Church Triumphant in heaven.
- 1 soul was transferred to another LCMS congregation outside our community.
- All told, 8 souls were subtracted from our congregation in 2024.
- The net change in baptized membership for 2024 at Trinity was +8 souls.

Pastoral Calls & Other Official Acts:

- 1 wedding, uniting one couple in the holy estate of marriage, was performed.
- 2 youth were confirmed and received as communicant members.
- 277 pastoral calls were made, 101 of them included the Lord's Supper.

In this upcoming we will continue to be who God has made us to be—disciples of Jesus. We will continue to do what Jesus has called us to do—make disciples of Jesus.

LWML-EUNICE NEWS (information for ALL women in the congregation)


