MUMC – CEMETERY RULES

- 1. No plots will be reserved in the cemetery. No future prepayment for plots.
- 2. Church members and their qualified minor dependents (up to 18 years) can be buried in the cemetery at no cost. Member's adult children who have a mental or physical impairment (unable to make decisions on their own; in a mental facility, or cannot care for their self) may be buried at no cost. (Trustees will determine eligibility.)
 - After January 1, 2016, any member, whose spouse is a qualified non-member, the spouse may be buried at a cost of \$1800 for a standard plot, or \$750 for a single Memorial Garden plot, or \$1500 for a double Memorial Garden plot. If a standard plot is used for a cremation urn/vault, the fee is \$1800 for a qualified non-member. Example: one burial is in a standard casket/vault, the other is a cremation. If a cremation urn/vault is used in a standard plot, the urn/vault should be buried in the plot at the head of the plot and centered.

A member may be buried in the Memorial Garden at no charge.

- 3. Standard and Memorial Garden plots are available for current members immediate family (mother, father, brother, sister, spouse, children) who are not members for a fee of \$1800 standard plot, Memorial Garden single plot of \$750, and a double plot of \$1500.
- 4. Every grave must have a stone marker and/or must be engraved within one year after death. Every tombstone must have a four inch concrete base and protrude six inches on all four sides of stone and be a ground level. A stone/granite base is acceptable. Stone/granite base must protrude six inches on all four sides of tombstone. Monuments cannot exceed a height of forty-eight inches. All marker/stones will face East.
- 5. Every vault/urn must be below ground level. All cremation urns/vaults must be below ground level; 18" from top of urn/vault if buried in a standard plot and centered at the head of the plot.
- 6. No curb or coping stones can be placed around gravesite. Edging stone may be used in the Memorial Garden when cast marker is used.
- 7. No foot markers are allowed except for service personnel and these must be ground level.
- 8. For safety reasons, no hold down wires are allowed on flowers.
- 9. No trees or shrubs may be planted in the Cemetery or Memorial Garden plots.
- 10. All open graves must be covered with an appropriate cover supplied by person/company opening grave to prevent anyone from falling into open grave.

MEMORIAL GARDEN & CREMATION PLOTS

- 1. Memorial Garden plot sizes are: Single 16x16" and double 36"x36".
- 2. All urns/vaults must be 18 inches below ground level from the top of the urn/vault.
- 3. Cremation vaults may be used and must be below ground level 18" from the top of the vault.
- 4. All markers will be placed above the urn/vault and must be installed within 1 year of burial and must be engraved or plaque added to cast marker within one year after death.
- 5. Markers may be stone or cast.
- 6. All markers will be at ground level.
- 7. Markers may be no larger than: 16"x16" single, or 36"x16" double. Pad and border for marker to sit on is 18"x18" for single, or 40"x20" for double.
- 8. All markers will face East.
- 9. Distance between Memorial Garden plots both single and double is 5 inches.
- 10. Trustees will make determination and location of grave site availability.
- 11. The Administrative Board/Church Council reserves the right to change or amend the rules of the church cemetery as needed.
