
120 to Landfall: 2.0 Tabletop Exercise | April 27, 2022



OBJECTIVES

- 1.Demonstrate the ability to establish lines of communication and facility points of contact used by healthcare stakeholders for emergency notifications and information sharing.
- 2.Demonstrate the capability for information sharing to ancillary healthcare providers (e.g., dialysis, home healthcare, assisted living, etc.), emergency management agencies, and regional emergency coordination points prior to, and during an evacuation.
- 3. Demonstrate the implementation of a policy, plan, or procedure implementing decisionmaking triggers used by healthcare stakeholders for executing the safe evacuation or shelter-in-place plans during an emergency.
- 4. Determine the resource needs for executing a full facility evacuation during an emergency incident and demonstrate the process for obtaining those resources.
- 5. Demonstrate the ability to prioritize the emergency evacuation process of patients when transportation resources are limited.
