I come in one night, in that little old house, of course there wasn't any electricity in them days of 1934, and I went to bed, Glory to God, and God began to knock at my heart. And I began to turn. After awhile, when I had repented of my sins, He sent the power of God on me. It just throwed me all over Glory to God! I'll never forthat bed. get that night. The Lord had even healed me when I was a child, but that was the first time I had ever felt the real power of God.

It was just a short while later that the Lord called Br. Howard Treece to come up higher.

"In Corinthians Paul said, For I mean not that others be eased and ye burdened: but by equality, that now at this time your abundance may be a supply for their want: that there may be equality. Mark says, "And whosoever will be chiefest, shall be servant of all."

It is not a commandment in the New Covenant: to pay tithes, which is a tenth. In Matthew, Jesus said, "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites: for ye pay tithes of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgement, mercy and faith: these ought ye to have done, and not leave the other undone." Remember, Have, means the past. Under the law they were commanded to tithe, but under the new covenant, Paul said. "Every man as he hath purposeth in his heart, so let him give."

Brother Paul was an ordained minister, an apostle, and a teacher. Paul had the care of all the churches. (Paul) said, "Neither did we eat any man's bread for nought; but wrought with labor and travail, night and day, that we might not be chargeable to any of you: Not because we have not power, but to make ourselves an ensample unto you to follow us."

(Paul) says, "For we hear that there are some which walk disorderly, working not at all, but are busy-bodies. Now they that are such, we command and exhort, by our Lord Jesus Christ, that with quietness they work, and eat their own bread."

All of you be subject one to another and be clothed with humility.



One day when she was away from them and worrying, the Lord spoke to her, "When I gave them the Holy Ghost, I gave them the same thing you have and I can keep them and take care of them too."

For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might. Whosoever destroy the works of the devil. is born of God doth not committ sin, for His seed remaineth in him and he cannot sin because he is born of God. If that verse was by itself, we say whoever rec'd the Holy Ghost, there wasn't no way for them to sin. But there's some more children of God. I want you people to know that you can sin before you get home. And when you do, you are no longer a child of God. Some people say "We sin more or less every day." They say you can committ sin and acknowledge it, then your all right. If a man committ sin today and then did acknowledge it and say-"I'm sorry of it." But went back out tom orrow and did the same thing, he'd still be a sinner. But you and I, children of God if we committ one sin, we are in death."

BR. BUFORD TROTMAN: "I believe that people who are trying to live for God don't want them things(Of the world). Seems like we have adopted the idea that we can do these things and the Lord won't remember them. We've shouted over them, we've had a good time over them, people have got the Holy Ghost over them, maybe the Lord will just forget about all of it. But He won't do it, will He.

This is a good Way. You talk about somebody without spot or wrinkle. They look good. They feel good. They come out once in awhile and get their head up and praise the Lord. They might not shout, but they can feel the Lord. It's wonderful to feel God in your soul..

Faults can be fixed, but sin can't! Sin will kill you, won't it? ... If our body couldn't be healed every time we cut our self or skinned ourself or bled, and it continually stayed there. You think about what we'd look like in a little while. Why, we'd look like a monster. ... If there was no way people could fix their faults, in a little while, they would be in the awfulest mess you ever saw. But if people will perfect them-selves by fixing their faults, they can be healed. A lot of people think a perfect man has never made a mistake, but perfect just means. without fault. To stay perfect, is keeping your faults fixed. When I was just a child and I grew up in The Way Of Holiness, that you couldn't get to heaven with a fault. And I thought about that a whole lot. Why I made mistakes. Other people made mistakes, but I got to thinking about it. We fix our faults, if we become a perfect child of God. ... by confessing our faults and not trying to justify ourself in them."

He leadeth me in the paths of

righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley

I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; Thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the

presence of mine enemies:

Thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: And I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

SHEEP, sheep!

Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that which the sheep sometimes have to pass entereth not by the door into the sheepfold (sheepfold; a yard or court), but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber.

But He that entereth in by the door is the Sheperd of the sheep.

To Him the poerter (Porter: a gate-warden; a watcher.) openeth; and the sheep hear His voice: and He calleth His sheep by name, and leadeth them out.

And when He putteth forth His own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow Him: for they know His voice. And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him; for they know not the voice of strangers.

Verily, verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep. All that ever came before me aretheives and robbers: but the sheep did not hear them. I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.

The theif cometh not out to for to steal and kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

I am the good sheperd: the good sheperd giveth his life for the sheep.

The best-known of psalms the Twentythird, was inspired by David's work as a boy, for it describes a day in his life as a shepherd.

In the morning the shepherd takes his crook and cudgel (rod and staff), his sling and stones. He does not drive his sheep but calls them to follow him. He knows each of them individually and every one of their names. They trust him completely because they know that, even though he may lead them through difficult or dangerous places, he will look after them. He guides them to rich grass, where they can lie down peacefully when they have fed, and to quietlyflowing water, avoiding noisy mountainstreams which frighten them.

The best pastures sometimes lie through ravines in the mountains, so dark and narrow that sunshine never reaches to their depths. Their gloom and cold terrify the sheep. But the shepherd cheerfully rattles his crook and cudgel against the rocks on either side, encouraging his sheep by calling out their names.

There are two dangers from which the shepherd must particularly protect his sheep. One is poisonous herbs, which they cannot distinguish from good grass. But the shepherd can, and he watches his sheep continually. If he sees one of them about to eat a poisonous plant, he calls it by name. Sometimes the plant looks so good that the sheep takes no notice of his warning. Then the shepherd quickly puts a stone in his sling and sends it hissing under the sheep's nose to save it from its own stupidity. Eastern shepherds have to be very skilful with their slings and spend a great deal of time practising with them.

Snakes are the other chief danger. They lie almost completely covered in sandy hollows, such as those made by the hooves of animals in desert places through which the sheep sometimes have to pass. The shepherd, walking in front of his sheep, stirs the sand round with the end of his crook in places where a snake may be hiding. If he finds one, he kills it with his cudgel, and the sheep follow in safety.

When, in the evening, the sheep return to the fold, the shepherd calls each of them to him in turn and, holding his crook level with the ground, makes every one jump over it. This shows him if any sheep is either lame or exhausted. He refreshes tired sheep by pouring oil on their heads and soothes their hurts by rubbing oil into scratches and cuts. Next, the shepherd fills a large, two-handled bowl to the brim with cool water from a cistern which he always keeps full. Beginning with the tired or hurt sheep, he gives a drink to each in turn. He refills the bowl after every sheep has drunk so that none of them needs strain to reach the water. All of them have a cup which 'runneth over'

At last the working day is over. Sitting at the opening of his tent, the shepherd sees running towards him a man hunted by two others. They nearly catch him; but in desperation the fugitive hurls himself into the shepherd's tent. The shepherd knows that his unexpected quest has killed someone, accidentally or intentionally. He knows, too, that his two pursuers are Avengers of Blood, probably relatives of the dead man, who have the right to kill the killer in turn. But the Eastern law of hospitality forbids the killing of a man when he has taken refuge in another man's home. The Avengers must wait outside until the killer leaves the tent.

The shepherd sees even in this a picture of God's loving-kindness. The Lord's goodness and mercy are like two Avengers of Blood. We may fly from them because we do not understand God's love. But they will drive us into the tent of the Good Shepherd himself, and by waiting for us outside, will see that we never leave it.

I am the good sheperd, and know my sheep, and are known of mine.

When the Son of Man shall come in His glory ... and before shall be gathered all nations and He shall divideth the sheep from the goats. And shall set the sheep on his right hand..... and say, Come ye blessed of my Father, inherit the knigdom...


I will both search my sheep and seek them out.


