Sis. Olga Knight

Sis. Olga Knight was 85 years old when she passed away into that good land, on July 26, 1988. She rec'd the Holy Ghost as a child, in 1913 in the Adamsburg community on Lookout Mtn above Fort Payne Alabama. She was, as far as we know, the oldest child of God among us.

A point of interest: Sis. Olga rec'd the Lord when she was real young. She married young. After she had some children, she was having a trial. She decided that surely she didn't have the Holy Ghost.

She went to meeting and stood up to tell the children of God that she didn't have the Holy Ghost anymore. She didn't know what happened, but when she came to herself, she was lying in the floor, speaking in tongues, and her dad, Br. John Whitley, was at her head, jumping up and down and clapping his hands.

Gamaliel

Gamaliel is only mentioned twice in the New Testament (Acts 5:34; 22:3), but he may have exerted a more profound influence on the course of Christianity than these brief references indicate. He was one of the few Jewish leaders who earned the title of *Rabban* ("our master, our great one") rather then the ordinary title *Rabbi* ("my master"). Gamaliel held a respected place on the Sanhedrin, the governing body of the Jewish religion. The Jews' high esteem for Gamaliel is demonstrated by one rabbi's comment made upon his death: "When Rabban Gamaliel the Elder died, the glory of the Law ceased and purity and abstinence died."

We find clues to Gamaliel's influence upon Christianity in the two Scripture references to him. In the first instance (Acts 5:34), the Sanhedrin met in a specially called session to deal with the Christians, who insisted that the Sanhedrin was responsible for the Messiah's death. In this emotionally heated session, Gamaliel rose and asked that Peter and the other Christians be excused for a moment so that he could speak. When this was done, he proceeded with a surprisingly insightful speech that obviously swayed the Sanhedrin: "And now I say unto you, Refrain from these men, and let them alone: for if this counsel or this work be of men, it will come to nought: But if it be of God, you cannot overthrow

it; lest haply ye be found even to fight against God!" (Acts 5:38-39). Rather than the flogging they anticipated, Peter and the apostles were given a severe warning and were released.

The second reference (Acts 22:3) was made by Paul, Gamaliel's former pupil. Paul was appealing to a Jewish mob, and he was not hesitant to link himself to this great teacher.

Gamaliel's greatness lay in his devotion to God and the Law. These incidents paint at least a partial portrait of his personality and Jewish tradition tells us that this elder statesman stressed the importance of repentance rather than of "works." Perhaps Paul's emphasis on this great Christian doctrine had its roots in Gamaliel's teaching.

Gamaliel's further influence on Paul can only be surmised. Surely Paul's great zeal—first for the Law, then for Christ—was captured from Gamaliel. Paul's love for the truth and his exhaustive understanding of the Scriptures might also be attributed to his teacher. With this training, anointed by the Holy Spirit, Paul built his New Testament treatises on the Christian faith, the church, justification, and regeneration. Paul's clear and logical manner of explaining the great doctrines of the Christian faith was no doubt the result, at least in part, of his schooling "at the feet of Gamaliel."

Br. Joe Eller of TIFTONIA had the saints undivided attention as he told of being lost without Christ, and going to meeting with his wife, Sis. Vickie. Br. Hodges Moore was up and saying, "There is no way you can get the Holy Ghost and then lose it, and then get it again."

When he went back to meeting, Br.Hodges again said that you couldn't rec' the Holy Ghost the second time.

Back at home his bible still told him that you could.

Of course he's looking for a job, but he is with his new bride full-time. And I am expecting him to take her to church."

SHREVEPORT, La. (UPI) — Lawyer N. Graves Thomas stood in a boat during a thunderstorm, raised his hands and proclaimed heavenward, "Here I am." Moments later a lightning bolt struck him dead, witnesses said.

was in the water preparing to ski, despite heavy storms that had rumbled through much of the state, officials said.

Witnesses said Thomas, 40, stood in the back of the boat, raised his hands toward the sky and said "Here I am." Quickly, the lightning bolt struck his head.

Attorneys who worked with or against Thomas described him as a firebrand and a maverick but a strong advocate for his often notorious clients — including police killers, reputed crime figures, accused white collar criminals and drug smugglers.

The Third Persecution, Under Trajan, A.D. 108

In the 3rd persecution Pliny the Second. a man learned and famous, seeing the lamentable slaughter of Christians, and moved therewith by pity, wrote to Trajan, certifying him that there were many thousands of them daily put to death, of which none did anything contrary to the Roman laws worthy persecution. "The whole account they gave of their crime or error (whichever it is to be called) amounted only to this - that they were accustomed on a stated day to meet before daylight, and to bind themselves by an obligation - not indeed to commit wickedness; bu t on the contrary - never to defraud any man: after which it was their custom to seperate, and reassmle to partake in common meal."

In this perrsecution suffered the blessed martyr, Ignatius, who is held in famous reverence among many. This Ignatius ... the bishopric of Antioch... Some do say, that he being sent fromSyria to Rome, because he professed Christ, was given to the wild beasts to be devoured. It is also said of him, that when he passed thru Asia, being under the most strict custody of his keepers, he strengthened and confirmed the churchs thru all the cities as he went, both with his exhortations and preaching the Word of God. Accordingly having come to Smyrna, he wrote to the church at Rome, exhorting them not touse means for his deliverence from martyrdom, lest they should deprive him of that which he most longed and hoped for. "Now I begin to be a disciple. I care nothing, of visible or invisible things, so that i may but win Christ. Let fire and the cross, let the companies of wild beasts, let breaking of bones and tearing of limbs, let the grinding of the whole body, and all the malice of the devil, come upon me; be it so,. only may I win Christ Jesus!" And even when he was sentenced to be thrown to the beasts suchwas the burning desire that he had to suffer, that he spake, wn at time he heard the lions roaring. saying: "I am the wheat of Christ: I am going to be ground with the teeth of wild beasts, that I may be found pure bread."

About this time Alexander, bishop of Rome, with two deacons were martyred. as where Quirinus and Hernes, with their famlies; Zenon, a Roman nobleman, and about 10,000 other Christians

In Mount Arrat many were crucified, crowned with thorns, and spears run into their sides, in imitation of Christ's passion. Eustachius, a brave and successful Roman commander, was by the empereor ordered

to join in an idolatrous sacrifice to celebrate some of his victories; but his faith was so much greater than his vanity, that he nobly refused it. Enraged at the denial the ungratful emperor forgot the service of this skilful commander, and ordered him and his whole family to be martyred.

At the martydom of Faustine and Jovita, brothers and citzens of Brescia, their torments were so many, and their patience so great, that Calocerius, a pagan, beholding them, was struck with admiration and exclaimed in a kind of ecstasy, "Great is the God of the Christians!" For which he was apprehended, and suffered the same fate.

Adrian dying in 138 A.D., was succeded by Pius, ... who stayed the persecutions against the Christians.

Words Worth Pondering

This was spoke by Ben Franklin at the assmbly of those drawing up the United States Constitution:

, "Mr. President: - I confess that I do not entirely approve of this Constitution at present; but, sir, I am not sure I shall never approve it; for, having lived long, (he was 81), I have experienced many instances of being obliged, by better information or fuller consideration, to change opinions even on important subjects, which I once thought right, but found to be otherwise. It is therefore that, the older I grow, the more apt I am to doubt my own judgement of others. Most men, indeed, as well as most sects in religion, think themselves in possession of all truth, and that wherever others differ from them, t is so far error. Steele a Protestant, in dedicaction. tells the Pope that the only difference between our two churchs in their opinions of the certainty of their doctrine is, the Romanish Church is infallible, and the Church of England is never wrong. But though many private persons think almost as highly of their own infallibility as that of the sect, few express it so naturally as a certain french lady, who, in a little disbute with her sister, said: "But I meet with nobody but myself that is always in the right."

In these sentiments, sir..."

Sissy stuff? Absolutely not. Simply better behavior and conduct, which is certain to lead to more happiness for individuals, and more pleasure for those with whom they associate.

Many uncoached students would be better prepared to go out and meet life's challenges with greater confidence if they were taught the pleasure and effectiveness that result from good manners.

And now a word from Ann Landers: Good manners should, of course, be taught in the home, but sad to say, too often no one in the home knows what good manners are nor will they take the time and expend the energy. The next best place, then, is in the schools.

When you get right down to it, good manners are nothing more than being thoughtful and considerate of others. They are the principal lubricant of the human machinery we use when we interact with others. I cannot think of an investment of time or energy that would pay off more handsomely.

Well, they are such things as knowing how to use a knife and a fork, young people standing when older people enter the room, asking ladies to go through a door first, not wearing a hat or cap inside the house or in any dining room. Good manners are the soft-pedaling of swearing and off-color stories, not acting bored, knowing how to give a firm

handshake and look a person in the eye when being introduced.

Good manners are an awareness of the importance of using soap and water and a washcloth frequently, saying "please" and "thank you" more often, eliminating loud and abusive talk, not gulping down food, or helping yourself to too large a portion when it is passed, answering invitations promptly and cordially, acknowledging gifts with a written note, greater courtesy on sidewalks and while seated behind a steering wheel, gentleness with spouses, brothers and sisters, the respectful treatment of parents and teachers.

Jerusalem and History

The most famous city in Bible lands is Jerusalem. From early times it was an important center. For example, Abram gave gifts to Melchizedek, who was the "king of Salem" (Gen. 14:18) this "Salem" was most likely the city of Jerusalem.

When the Israelites conquered the Promised Land, Benjamin's tribe was assigned the territory that included Jerusalem. But the invading armies were not strong enough to capture the city, and it was not until King David's time that Jerusalem finally became Hebrew territory (2 Samuel 5:6-7). David made the city his capital. He brought the ark of the covenant there, pitched a suitable tent for it, and began planning a temple to house the ark. His son Solomon completed the job (2 Sam. 7:12-16 and 1 Kings 5-6).

Later kings neglected both the temple and the city of Jerusalem. But at the height of its glory, Jerusalem was a showplace of the nation and the temple was world-famous. The greatest era in the history of the city and temple was under Sol-

omon.

The city was protected by God when the national leaders worshiped Him and trusted Him. When Sennacherib attempted to destroy it, the Assyrian army was destroyed by a miracle from

God (2 Kings 19:35-37).

In 587 B.C., Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon invaded Palestine, overran the city, and took the people away as slaves. The expensive treasures that were housed in the city and the many skilled craftsmen who maintained the valuable works of art and architectural design, are described in 2 Kings 24:10-17.

For 50 years the city of Jerusalem lay in waste, but in 537 B.C. Zerubbabel and 50,000 followers were allowed to return and start rebuilding (Ezra 2:64-65; 3:8). Nehemiah rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem in about 444 B.C. (Neh. 6:15). Slowly, the Hebrews returned from their captivity and worked at rebuilding other sections of their city.

Other strong nations arose—the Greeks under

Alexander the Great, the Egyptians, and the Persians. In 198 B.C., Jerusalem became a part of the Seleucid empire. Judas Maccabee, one of Israel's greatest heros, retook the city in 165 B.C. and purified the temple.

In 63 B.C., Roman armies swept through Palestine and captured Jerusalem, ruining what was left of Zerubbabel's attempts to rebuild the temple. However, in 37 B.C., Herod the Great began rebuilding the temple on a grand scale; his work was so complex that the temple wasn't complete when Jesus was taken there as a baby (Luke 2:21-39). The end of Jerusalem's history in biblical times came when Titus, the Roman emperor, leveled the city and temple in A.D. 70.

Despite the troubled history of the "holy city." it still stands as a symbol of the Jewish people. "Zion" is one name given to it (although this really refers to one of the several hills around Jerusalem). The Bible calls the city by various names of honor: "city of David" (2 Sam. 5:7); "city of God" (Psa. 46:4); "city of truth" (Zec. 8:3); "holy city" (Neh. 11:1); "throne of the Lord" (Jer. 3:17) and many more.

The Egyptian pharaoh's daughter visited Solomon there (1 Kings 3:1); the Queen of Sheba also visited (1 Kings 10:1-2). Many events of Jesus' earthly ministry occurred there: Palm Sunday, the meal in an upper room, the trials and death of Christ, and His appearance after the Resurrection (Luke 24:33ff).

In both Hebrews and Revelation, Jerusalem symbolizes the future hope of Christians who are faithful. The fact that heaven is called the "New Jerusalem" (Rev. 21:2) shows that eternal life will be beautiful and wonderful, even as a perfect Jerusalem would be (Heb. 12:22; Rev. 21:10;

Even today, Jerusalem is a center for historical study and international struggle. Three world religions claim it as a holy city-Islam, Judaism, and Christianity.

"Divine" healing;

So, as the strength of the church, so the strength of divine healing. o.

We all know that healing is emhasied in James; IS THERE ANY SICK AMONG YOU? LET THEM CALL FOR THE ELDERS OF THE CHURCH, AND LET THEM PRAY OVER THEM, ANOINTING HIM WITH OIL IN THE NAME OF THE LORD: AND THE PRAYER OF FAITH SHALL SVALTHE SICK AND THE LORD SHALL RAISE HIM UP... The prayer of faith is what always does the work in divine healing. Without it, there is no healing. With it, always comes healing.

If one lives in a way that he doubts the Lord will heal him. The Lord won't. But when a person's $\text{li}\vec{r}\text{e}$ is in order with the Word of God, the Lord gives the faith, and healings always follow.

Be sure, one sometimes has to have patience, waiting on the Lord, but the Lord always rewards Godly living, with faith.

When the Lord set up His church, he put healing in it. When one believes on the Lord Jesus Christ, and is baptised in His name, one of the signs that Christ promised would follow them is; THEY SHALL LAY HANDS ON THE SICK AND THEY SHALL RECOVER.

Job probably had more trouble, sickness and pain than any man ever had. But regardless of his down cast thoughts, the Lord restored his health and everything he had lost and more, because he knew how he had lived before God, and that he would do Him right. Now, that's faith!

Daniel's faith never wavered, come good times, or bad. It didn't even fail him in a pit of lions.

The Syrophenician wamans faith in the Lord would not let her give up in the face of His refusal. The Lord Jesus marveled at her faith and sent the healing.

The blind man's faith was such, that when they tried to quieten his yelling for the Lord, that he got his petition answered. he walked away with good eyesight.

Now, as with all things that are good, we don't just sit back, relax, and take it easy. When we rec'd the Holy Ghost, we had to press our claim to Him. Sometimes we had to lay aside things that hinder d us. When we got ourselves right, the Lord moved. So with God's healing. When we ask Him for our healing and it don't come, we then have to seek for it. Pray. Find out if anything in our life is no t according to His will. Pray for the Word of God to come and show us where we are at in Him. Find out if any has ought aganst us. Check and see if a neighbor has a need that we can fill. The Lord promised, SEEK AND YE SHALL FIND. and, HE THAT HATH MY COMMANDMENTS, AND KEEPETH THEM ... I WILL LOVE HIM AND MANIFEST MYSELF TO HIM.

The denomination who left the full gospel of godly living, and set up their owaright-ousness go to man for their healing. If and when divine healing is mentioned, they say, "Yea, I was healed. The Lord directed the doctor knife when they operated...." GOd could do it if he wanted to, but we know they do it thru the vast knowledge they have obtained by much learning.

Man landed a spaceship on the moon. God didn't put it there, but he could have, if he had wanted to.

I was so happy. I was jumping up and downand hugging everybody.


Now I've got the Lord to help me in schooland walk with me every step of the Way.

Moses

The most crucial figure of Old Testament history was Moses, who led the people of Israel out of bondage. Some commentators believe that his name is a combination of the late Egyptian words for "water" (mo) and "take" (shi). Thus is may be a reminder of how the pharaoh's daughter took the infant Moses from a basket on the Nile (Exod.

Moses had an older brother named Aaron and a sister named Miriam. He was born just after the Egyptian pharaoh ordered his soldiers to kill all new Israelite babies to control the population of the slaves. Moses' mother made a basket of bulrushes, placed him in it, and floated it on the Nile River under the watchful eye of his sister. When the pharaoh's daughter found the baby, she adopted him into the royal family.

When Moses was a young man, he killed an Egyptian slave driver in a fit of rage, (Exod. 2:11 ff.). He escaped into the rugged land of Midian, where he married a priest's

daughter named Zipporah. Together they had two sons—Gershom and Eliezer (Exod. 2:22; 18:4).

After Moses had lived in Midian for about 40 years, the Lord appeared to him in a burning bush on the side of Mt. Sinai or Horeb (Exod. 3). He instructed Moses to lead his people out of Egypt to the Promised Land of Canaan. Moses protested that he would not be able to convince

Christ.

the pharaoh to let the Israelites leave, so the Lord allowed him to take Aaron as his spokesman.

Moses went back to Egypt and conveyed God's message to "let my people go." When the pharaoh demanded a sign of divine power to confirm Moses' message, Moses was pitted against the pharaoh's court magicians. (According to Jewish tradition, they were named Jannes and Jambres.) Though the pharaoh saw Moses and Aaron perform miracles more spectacular than those of his own magicians, he refused to let the people of Israel leave his land. So God sent a series of ten plagues, culminating in the death of all the first born of Egypt-including the pharaoh's own son-to convince the ruler who finally decided to honor Moses' request. Even so, the pharaoh changed his mind while the Israelites were leaving. He tried to stop them at the shores of the Red Sea, but God parted the waters so that the Israelites could escape.

Moses led his people to Mt. Sinai, where he met with God and received a system of law to govern them in the Promised Land. God summarized this Law in the Ten Commandments, which He engraved on tablets of stone that Moses brought back to the Israelite camp. Moses found that his people had turned to pagan worship, and he angrily dashed the tablets to the ground, symbolizing the people's breaking of the covenant. After the people repented of their sin, Moses returned to the mountain and received the Ten Commandments once again.

For 40 years the Israelites wandered in the wilderness between Sinai and Canaan. During this time, Moses and Aaron were their civil and religious rulers. God prevented Moses from entering the Promised Land because he had disobeyed the Lord at Meribah, where he struck a stone with his rod to receive water. Yet God allowed Moses to view the Promised Land from the top of Mt.

Nebo. Then Moses died.

In the 120 years of his life, Moses had led his people in their journey from bondage to freedom. He had recorded their past history by writing what are now the first five books of the Old Testament, and he had received the Law that would govern them for centuries to come.

And, CHRIST IS ALL, AND IN ALL. He gave His lifeblood and Life for the church. He loves it.

He also put "Gifts" in His church for it perfection, for its ministry, for edifying of this body, for knowledge of the Son of God, to point and assist saints to the fulness of Chirst.

Who and what are these gifts: Apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, teachers, helps, governments, bishops (or elders) and deacons.

APOSTLE: a delegate, an ambassador of the Gospel with miraculos powers, a messanger.

PROPHET: a foreteller; and inspired speaker.

EVANGELIST: a preacher of the Gospel.

PASTOR: a shepherd; one who feeds.

TEACHER: an instructor; teacher.

HELPS: succor; relief; assistance.

GOVERNMENT: to pilot; steer; directorship.

BISHOP: Superintendent; overseer.

DEACON: an attendant; wait upon; minister; teacher and/or pastor; servant.

In the church there are other gifts such as, THE WORD OF WISDOM and THE WORD OF KNOWLEDGE, but these are supposed by some to be coveredunder the already said gifts. The Deacon as can be seen is covered by the gift of pastoring and te aching. It seems like most of these gifts infringe on another gift, but they all are operated by the Spirit of the Lord for our profit.

The gift of the Apostle is thought by many to have been fulfilled in the 12 Apostles, but others say that they can operate today. We here are open on the subject, but would be real glad if they showed up amongst us. We need all the ministerial gifts we can get.

These gifts are given to the church. If a man is a teacher, he will teach wherever he is at, if and when the leading of the Lord moves on him.

It's the same if he is a pastor or any other gift. He does it wherever he is at.

It is good if a church (a unit) has a pastor or teacher or any other of the gifts, or even more than one of the same gifts working in it. It is to their profit if they love the truth. But if they are not in full force at a certain place, it does not mean it is any less, a unit, or a part of the body of Christ, as some would make you believe.

To be a church you have to have Christ as your head and meet or assmble together in the Lord's name.

Most of thse gifts have a qualification to them. Not all are exactly the same but generaly they run into: being blameless(that cuts out many), One wife, watchful, sober, alw ays behaves himself well, especially in the church. All have to be given to hospitality. Satisfied with what he has (Can't be greedy for money). Has to have his house under subjection. He has to rule well his own house, before Christ will give him any rule in His church.

When these gifts move, they can be judged of God or not by there words. They must PREACH THE WORD, not what they believe or have figured out. The Word of God never changes. So if just The Word is preached, the church will always be the same. It wil never change because it is builton The Word. IF ANY MAN SPEAK, LET HIM SPEAK AS THE ORACLES OF GOD... THAT GOD IN ALL THINGS MAY BE GLORIFIED THRU JESUS CHRIST. (We hear preachers glorified more then Christ in many Holiness churchs).

Every gift that the Lord put in His

church are very important. But today we are about like the denominations, about the only gifts reconised are pastors and evangelists. But we need every one of them, That is the main reason we are looking so lopsided. The pastors need teach ing too. If not they'll beomes LORDS OVER GODS HEIRTAGE.
