Roberts and family-Rosalie; Brother Ira Stephens and family-Paint Rock Valley; Brother General Arnold and family-Paint Rock Valley; Mr. John Mason and family-Huntsville. In 1947, Brother Earl Clark and family and Brother Vernon Stephens and family moved here from Tennessee.

After these families moved here, we began to have church at the houses. Brother Horton Wright had an empty building on his place, so we had church there for a few months. Then we had church at Mr. John Masons until our first church was built.

Our first church was built in 1947. The land was donated by Brother Curt Wade. The community gave their labor and by the end of the year 1947, we had our first church ready for use.

We used it until March, 1967. By this time the church was in need of repair. We voted to build a new one. We decided that we needed more room, as our congregation had increased to about seventy-five members.


Since we needed more land, Mr. Wilson Shafer gave 1/2 acre. Again the members gave their labor and built our new church.

A CANCER OR A CROWN?

Cancer is a dreaded curse that plagues our generation. Just the mention of the word brings memories of friends and loved ones who have fought this formidable enemy. I watched my dear mother suffer with colon and liver cancer, and I'll never forget the telephone call that brought us news of her death. Another of God's children had lost the battle to this deadly foe.

But a Christian wife needs to be aware of an attitude of heart just as deadly as cancer. The wisest king who ever lived compared an unfaithful wife to cancer. He said in Proverbs 12:4, "A virtuous woman is a crown to her husband: but she that maketh ashamed is as rottenness in his bones." A woman who brings shame to her husband is just like "rottenness in his bones"—bone cancer!

We learned terrible things from the Chernobyl nuclear disaster. The intense radiation caused deterioration of the bone marrow much like that caused by cancer. The destruction of infection-fighting blood cells caused a breakdown of the body's immune system. When the immune system is not able to function, then a simple cold or flugerm can cause death.

Now, compare the awfulness of bone cancer to the plight of an aching husband whose wife causes him shame. Perhaps she has given higher priority to other things—her children, her social standing in the community, her ministry in the church—than she has given to her husband. She may ignore his manly interests in sports, hunting, building, or his job-related concerns. She may ridicule his spiritual leadership. Instead of meshing her life with his, she takes her own self-made "fork in the road."

As she and her mate drift apart, she no longer delights in finding out what his needs and desires are and satisfying them. She doesn't work at identifying with his joys and empathizing with his sorrows. Before long, it seems they are two separate individuals who happen to share the same bed at night. She has forgotten First Corinthians 7:34, where Paul comments, "She that is married ... careth how she may please her husband."

Slowly but surely this "cancer" will eat away at a man. Then it might be

seduce him. He may find that he can't seem to withstand infectious temptations like he used to, because his immune system has been destroyed by his wife's spiritual cancer. Many a man, in that situation, desperately searches God's Word for spiritual strength and agonizes in prayer.

But those physical and emotional longings—those unsatisfied needs—only bring about more and more frustration, until one day he may not be able to handle it anymore. Maybe weeks or months later, his fall into sin is exposed or condemned.

And it may be that only his wife knows how much the blame for his fall lies on her. Oh, what a destructive cancer an unfaithful wife can be!

But, as the other half of Proverbs 12:4 says, "A virtuous woman is a crown to her husband." A truly spiritual woman realizes her great responsibility to her husband. She is willing to make whatever personal sacrifices are needed to make her husband the successful man that he can be with her total support.

I've heard women angrily say, "I could just CROWN him for that!" Obviously, this was not the kind of crowning King Solomon was referring to in this proverb!

Instead, to be my husband's crown, I should seek the ways by which I can crown my husband and make him king of our home. His desires should become the delights of my life, as I willingly serve and honor him.

And, amazingly enough—as I crown him the king he deserves to be, he crowns me the queen I long to be. "The heart of her husband doth safely trust in her, so that he shall have no need of spoil. . . Her children arise up, and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praiseth her" (Prov. 31:11, 28).

That is the kind of wife I want to be: a crown, not a cancer!

The 4th weekend of March, the Texas saints, Sis. Janet Stark of Alvarado Texas, and Sis. This letter was written in the early 1980's in answer to a question of what Holiness believed in the north Alabama area: Parts being put in a book that was later written by the questioner:

We will try to state the doctrine of the Holiness movement that is largely in north Alabama and over-flowing into Tennessee and Georgia, with a few scattered into other states.

There are about forty odd churchs, or groups of people, who call themselves Holiness. They have no head except that which is in heaven, though some lean toward one or more churchs being over them, in the sense that they were the old churchs and were to them in a ftherly sense.

They use the name of Holiness, mostly from Isaiah: 35, where it tells if the goodness of the Lord, being given to His people: AND AN HICHWAY SHALL BE THERE, AND A WAY, AND IT SHALL BE CALLED THE WAY OF HOLINESS ... Some of them, usually the younger, say that they are the real Church of God. But the majority hold to The Way of Holines, citing, the apostles preach about the Way.

In all the forty or so meeting places, they all have a slight different view on minor things, such as; some for music, some anti- music. At one time there was no music in any of the meeting houses. Now it's about fifty-fifty with the trend to more and more having music. Though most have only pianos, some have organs, guitars, and some have more.

Some hold to divine healing as a way of life. Others use remedies with others trusting in medicine and doctors. As with music, so with healing. When the Way of Holiness first came in this area in the early 1900's, everyone trusted the Lord all the way. They used the scripture—WHATSOEVER YE SHALL ASK IN MY NAME, THAT WILL I do, that the Father may be glorfied in the Son. — IF YE SHALL ASK ANYTHING IN MYNAME, I WILL DO IT. And in James' writing— IS THERE ANY SICK AMONG YOU? LET THEM CALL FOR THE ELDERS OF THE CHURCH AND LET THEM PRAY OVER HIM, ANOINTING HIM WITH OIL IN THE NAME OF THE LORD: AND THE PRAYER OF FAITH SHALL SAVE THESICK AND THE LORD SHALL RAISE THEM UP. There is slighty more churchs who go to men for their healing then those that put their trust in the Lord. Like the music, there are more and more going towards trusting men.

There are differences in the use of tobacco, t.v., ball games and wordily amusements and such.

There are some things that all these churchs do agree on; All men have sinned and come short of the glory of God.

Jesus Christ is the answer to sin. Believing in the three in one. The father, Son and the Holy Ghost. That the works of grace, believeing, sanctification, and being filled with the Holy Ghost are all one act of grace. That repentance brings the soul to the Lord, and/or being filled with the Holy Ghost; THERE IS MORE REJOICING IN HEAVEN OVER ONE SINNER REPENTING, THAN NINIY-NINE JUST PERSONS, WHICH NEED NO REPENTANCE. YE ARE NOT IN THE FLESH, BUT IN THE SPIRIT, IF SO BE THAT THE SPIRIT OF GOD DWELL IN YOU. And - NOW IF ANY MAN HAVE NOT THE SPIRIT OF CHRIST, HE IS NONE OF HIS. As the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost are one, so is the Comforter, the Holy Ghost, and the Spirit of Christ. That it takes the Holy Ghost coming into a man to be born again. John talked of water baptism, but promised that Christ would baptise them with the Holy Ghost and fire. Also - a man cannot worship the Lord without the Holy Ghost: GOD IS A SPIRIT; AND THEY THAT WORSHIP HIM, MUST WORSHIP HIM IN SPIRIT AND IN TRUTH. And - EXCEPT AMAN BE BORNOF THE WATER AND OF THE SPIRIT, HE CANNOT ENTER INTO THE KINGDOM GOD. - THAT THAT IS BORN OF FLESH IS FLESH, THAT THAT IS BORN OF THE SPIRIT IS SPIRIT. That Paul said, - NO MAN CAN SAY THAT JESUS IS LORD, BUT BY THE HOLY GHOST. Also -THE HOLY SPIRIT OF GOD, WHERE BY YE ARE SEALED UNTO THE DAY OF REDEEPTION, - and - ASMANY AS ARE LED BY THE SPIRIT OF GOD, THEY ARE THE SONS OF GOD.

They all agree that after the lord has forgiven a man and given him of His Spirit, that he will not sin again.—WHOSOEVER ABIDETH IN HIM SINNEIH NOT: WHOSOEVER SINNEIH HATH NOT SEEN HIM NETTHER KNOWN HIM. HE THAT DOETH RIGHIOUSNESS IS RICHIOUS, EVEN AS HE IS RICHIOUS. HE THAT COMMITTEIH SIN IS OF THE DEVIL: FOR THE DEVIL SINNEIH FROM THE BEGINING.—WHOSOEVER IS BORN OF GOD DOTH NOT COMMITT SIN: FOR HIS SEED REMAINEIH IN HIM AND HE CANNOT SIN, BECAUSE HE IS BORN OF GOD. IN THIS THE CHILDREN OF GOD ARE MANIFEST, AND THE CHILDREN OF THE DEVIL.—IF WE SIN WILLFULLY AFTER WAS HAVE REC"D THE KNOWLEDGE OF THE TRUIH, THERE REMAINEIH NO MRE SACRIFICE FOR SIN. AWAKE TO RICHIOUSNESS AND SIN NOT.—HE THAT DOETH EVIL HATH NOT SEEN GOD.—FOR THE WAGES OF SIN IS DEATH.


A CUP OF TEA!

At the time of the 1st meeting, which was the last Sunday in May, 1974, only 19 people in the congregation had the Holy Ghost. The 1st one to rec' the Holy Ghost was Br. Cliff's daughter, Sis. Jenifer Hurst, on the 1st Sunday of June, 1974.

We've seen some wonderful times. God has really blessed. Br. Jack Hawkins wife, Sis. Irene, was healed of cancer. Up to the death of Br. Hawkins, October 7, 1977, 25 rec'd the Holy Ghost. He died at the age of 7/4

On November 23, 1977 Sis. Loretta Yeager was baptised with the Holy Ghost. That same night, Br. Thurman Isbell suffered a heart attack just a few minutes after he got home
