

This year's Bible Bowl will be held on November 8, 2025, from 8:30 AM – 3:00 PM.

The book of study is JOHN, Chapters 1-21. Our host congregation is the Missouri City Church of Christ.

We will use the English Standard Version (ESV) translation of Bible for this competition.

Youth will be challenged in a written exam and honored with individual trophies/medals! The individual competition will include:

- Scripture Search (open bible search of scriptures throughout the Bible to fill in blanks)
- Multiple Choice
- Tiebreaker (questions from the standard memorization list)
- Thematic Comprehension Questions (High School & Adult competitors)

We also host a team competition for youth ages 10–18 and ADULTS.

Teams will be honored with team trophies/medals!

The Team competition will include:

- True/False
- Multiple Choice
- Comprehension
- Scripture Quotation
- Speed Round
