



III. May - December 2012 Accomplishments

- 1. Seasonal air traffic control tower
- 2. Town prevailed in SEQRA litigation
- 3. Improved data collection technology
- 4. Assessed data for Part 161 process
- 5. Improved helicopter routing
- 6. Continued dialogue with FAA to secure funding for perimeter fence

III. May – December 2012 Accomplishments

Improved helicopter routing

- North Shore route adopted in August 2012
- South Shore route under consideration

• Return to historic use of power line flight path for traffic to and from North Shore route



III. May - December 2012 Accomplishments

Continued dialogue with FAA to secure funding for perimeter fence

- Fence is critical for safety and security
- Proposed FAA requirements for wildlife hazards
- Fence cost:
 - Design: \$ 80,000
 - Construction: \$575,000
 - Total \$ 655,000
- FAA waiting for Town resolution before approving grant for fence design

2013 Seasonal Air Traffic Control Tower

- Team currently working with FAA to secure approval for *permanent* seasonal tower
- Approval requires federal environmental review
- Target dates for 2013 tower operation: May
 1 September 30



Financial

- Maintain self sufficiency with an operating surplus
- Surplus not enough to fund ATCT and capital needs
- Federal grants needed entitled to \$150,000/year
- Revise airport landing and other fees (Town Code)

Projects Needing Immediate Funding

Link

- Perimeter fence design \$80,000
- Perimeter fence construction \$575,000
- Air traffic control tower \$415,000
- Next phase of Part 161 process \$??
- Runway 4-22 rehabilitation \$195,000





Management

- Enhance airport management authority
- Revenue enhancement
 - Potential privatization of fuel farm
 - Parking plan RFP
 - Landing fees
- Security plan draft for Town Board approval
- Review revisions to Town Code and Airport Minimum Standards
- Submit ACIP for Town Board approval



V. Next Steps

Staff and Consultants

- 1. Support South Shore (Atlantic) helicopter route
- 2. Secure approval for permanent seasonal ATCT
- 3. Present revised minimum standards and fees for Town Board approval
- 4. Present fuel farm and parking privatization options



V. Next Steps

Town Board

- 1. Adopt resolution committing to construct perimeter fence and to submit ACIP
- Provide direction for further steps in Part 161 process
- 3. Adopt local law to revise Town Code (airport rules, regulations and fees)
- 4. Adopt security plan
