Kathryn Slye, small recreational pilot spoke about the restrictions being put on local pilots. You are only hurting us the local small pilots by these fines and penalties. She spoke about how the fines are literally grounding the local pilot. You should make a waiver for locally based pilots to be able to land after the restriction time.

Andy Sabin representing Keep the Airport Open. He asked the town to do a few steps to restore the airport to the condition it was in years ago. He had a petition signed by over 900 persons asking for such. The airport funds should be being used to maintain the airport not to pay for attorneys.

Nick Marlin thanked the board for their actions at the airport. He would like to see the local pilots taken care of but not the large plains.

Walker Bragman lives in Northwest area. He spoke about the airport and supports the efforts of the Town Board. Second homes should not get priority over year round homes. The businesses will survive without large plains. He is glad that this board is considering our street not Wall Street.

Pat Trunzo longtime resident of the Town states that he is in support of these penalties. He believes the board is not neglecting the airport.

Fred Overton says that he is not pleased with Walker saying that he is a voice of the Republican parties and he disagrees with him fully and believes the Republican Party would agree. Mr. Overton has run on both parties and is registered Blank.

Julie Sweeney spoke about the bids for the concession stands. She says that she bid and did not include a menu so she lost the bid. Larry states that when their is a competitive bid you must include the items required.

Jeffrey Bragman speaking about the airport. Happy that people are finally recognizing that airport noise is a quality of life problem. He thanks the board for what they have done and urges the board to do even more. Take back this airport and restore it to what it was designed for.

Diana Walker here to talk about affordable workforce housing. There was a story in the paper about assessing new homes over a certain sq. Footage which would be put into a special fund for housing needs.

Susan McGraw Keber says that the Bragman family is pleased with the three laws at the airport but still would like to see the fourth one instituted. She believes that we need to ban the helicopters. She still has problems with how we are going to keep track of the landings. She thinks that the Town needs to seek new council on this matter. She is concerned that some day we will have Jet Blue or Delta flying into the airport.

Pat Trunzo spoke about the resolution retaining Michael Baker for airport obstructions. He feels that the board is skipping around and he thinks they should look at the overall picture then go after the solution. You are putting the cart before the horse. The airport was designed for A & B aircraft and not C & D aircraft. Please look at all the problems and then make a constructive decision.

Zachary Cohen spoke about property being bought from Suffolk County and he questioned the use of development rights associated with these properties. He states that he has the honor to be the chairman of the Nature Preserve Committee. He wanted to speak about some issues that are being talked about wrongly. He went on to explain how the committee actually feels about the Nature Preserve in the Dolphin Drive area. He believes the board could put the matter off to June.

Mike Salochy says that Zach asked him to write a letter about the Japanese Pines. We have been targeted for five years now just pass the law. Stop all this rubbish.

Jonathan Wallace agrees with the previous speaker. He questions what jurisdiction the Nature Preserve Committee has over parking on streets. Come to the area and see what we are dealing with. There is endangered natural grasses where the pines are. We had signage there for forty years and it was changed without notice. What we have here is a perfect storm. Our road in a couple of weeks is going to look like the roadway by Cyril's. Do not table the vote.

Loring Boldger lives in Springs and would like to go to this gentleman's house but there is not where to park.

Norman Edwards says that he lives in the area and their is parking within their community if anyone would like to come see the area.

A LOCAL LAW amending Sections 255-11-64 (Uses Prohibited in Single-Family Residences) to provide for an enhanced penalties schedule for violations

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION 1. Legislative Intent.

This legislation is intended to enhance the penalty schedule for violations of those prohibited uses in single-family residences.

SECTION 2. Amendment.

Section 255-11-64, (Uses Prohibited in Single-Family Residences), of the East Hampton Town Code is hereby amended by deleting the stricken words and adding the underlined words as follows:

No person, including the owner, shall use or permit to be used any single-family residence for any of the following:

A. Two-family residence. Creation, use or maintenance of a two-family residence as defined herein, except as may be authorized in certain cases by special permit pursuant to the Use Table and Article V. A violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

B. Multifamily occupancy. Occupancy at any time by more than one family, except as permitted by § 255-11-62C(3) and (4) hereof. A violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

C. Partial occupancy or rental. Rentals to, or use or occupancy by, any person or persons of less than the entire residence, except as permitted in § 255-11-62C(3) and (4) hereof. A violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

- D. Excessive turnover. Except in the case of the rental of guest rooms pursuant to § 255-11-62C(3) hereof, rentals, tenancies or occupancies constituting motel use as defined in § 255-1-20 ("motel") hereof. [Amended 5-15-2014 by L.L. No. 9-2014]
- E. Shares. The selling of shares or the establishing of other ownership, tenancy or use arrangements in which individuals obtain rights of occupancy in individual bedrooms, whether or not specifically identified, or rights to occupy all or part of the residence on particular days of the week, specified weekends or other similar occasions or terms.
- F. Fractionalized ownership interests. The creation of cooperative-style ownership, less-than-fee simple ownership or other similar arrangements resulting in proprietary tenancies for one or more persons in the residence, the establishment of interval or time-sharing ownership for any person in all or any part of the residence, or the like. However, this subsection shall not be deemed to preclude the creation of mortgages, liens, easements or other similar interests encumbering the residential property as a whole to secure a loan or for any other legitimate purposes.
- G. Parking. When in use pursuant to § 255-11-62D hereof, parking of vehicles of occupants and their visitors on the street or on any property other than the lot on which the residence is located or parking overnight of more than four vehicles on said lot shall be prohibited. A violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

H. Overcrowding. Occupancy of any bedroom by more occupants than permitted by the minimum area requirements set forth in § 255-11-67A(9). A violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

- (1) The parking on a residential lot of commercially registered (including livery) cars or light trucks if the same are used by an occupant of the residence on the lot on which the vehicle is parked, with the exception of vehicles designed for or utilized for the storage and/or transportation of fuel products (gasoline, oil, propane, kerosene products or any other similar combustible compound) or other combustible compounds, which shall not be parked on any residential lot. This provision shall not be deemed to prevent the temporary parking of such a vehicle on a residential lot, provided that said vehicle is actively engaged in the delivery of product to the premises on the residential lot on which it is parked.
- (2) The outdoor storage on a residential lot of up to two boats or any number of such boats used in connection with a home occupation as defined in Article I.
- (3) Any home occupation or home office use, as the same are defined and permitted herein.
- J. Penalties. Any person found guilty of a violation of any provision of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$2,500 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both. For a second offense in less than two years, any person found guilty of a violation of any provision of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$1,500 nor more than \$5,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both. For a third offense in less than five years, any person found guilty of a violation of any provision of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$2,500 nor more than \$10,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

Establish a Policy and Procedure Regarding Employee Health Coverage Eligibility

PROCEDURE AND POLICY

Regarding Employee eligibility for the Health Plan

This is the Procedure and Policy regarding Employee eligibility for the Health Plan. This Policy is developed so that the Town of East Hampton Employee Benefit Plan will comply with the new rules required by the new Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. We will continue to have our annual Open Enrollment events.

DEFINITIONS

Eligibility? All Employees who are paid an average of 30 hours or more per week are eligible for the Health Plan. This does not include Employees hired for seasonal or temporary work.

Employer ?Town of East Hampton

Health Care Full Time ? (HCFT) Employees who are reasonably expected to be paid 30 hours or more per week, or who were expected to be part time Employees, but during the Measurement Period, were later determined to be Health Care Eligible.

Health Care Part Time ? (HCPT) Employees who are reasonably expected to be paid fewer than 30 hours on average per week.

Health Plan? The Town of East Hampton Employee Benefit Plan

Initial Administrative Period ? Length of time allowed for processing the eligibility paperwork and getting the new Employee enrolled.

Initial Measurement Period? Length of time allowed to evaluate a new Employee?s hours to determine their eligibility for the Health Plan.

Initial Stability Period ? Length of time New Employees are enrolled in the Health Plan after eligibility for coverage is determined they qualify.

Standard Administrative Period ? Length of time allowed for processing the eligibility paperwork and getting the existing Employee enrolled. This will run from the end of the Standard Measurement Period thru December 31. This is an annual time frame and will occur every year.

Standard Measurement Period? Length of time allowed to evaluate an existing Employee?s hours to determine their eligibility for the Health Plan. This time will run from December 1st through the next years to November 30th (12 months). This is an annual time frame and will occur every year.

Standard Stability Period ? Length of time existing Employees are enrolled in the Health Plan after it is determined they qualify. This will run for a 12 month period from January 1 until December 31. This is an annual time frame and will occur every year.

Temporary/Seasonal Employee ? This is an Employee who, at the time of hire, has a predetermined end of employment date and the total time in employment will not exceed 120 days.

IMPLEMENTATION

For the purpose of this policy, the Employer will need to make an initial determination for all existing and New Employees.

This determination is if the Employee will be paid an average of 30 hours per week or more on a regular basis.

If the Employer believes the Employee will be paid for 30 hours or more per week on average, the Employer will offer the Employee an opportunity to 1) sign up for one of our available plans with an effective date of January 1, 2015 or 2) waive coverage. Employees in this group will be referred to as Health Care Full Time (HCFT).

If the Employer believes the Employee will be paid less than 30 hours per week on average, the Employer will implement a Measurement Period to determine if the Employee is, or is not, eligible for the Health Plan. Employees in this group will be referred to as Health Care Part Time (HCPT)

For purposes of this policy, we will divide Employees into two groups: Existing Employees as of December 1, 2013 and Employees hired after that date.

WHEREAS, after considering the matter and the comments of the public at the time of hearing, the Town Board believes that the establishment of the subject parking restrictions are in the best interests of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local law is a Type II action pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) 6 NYCRR Part 617.5(16) and Chapter 128 of the Town Code; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, said Local Law is hereby adopted to read as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 6 OF 2015 Intro. # 44 of 2014

A Local Law providing for the amendment of Chapter 240, Section 240-61 ("Schedule XI: Parking Prohibited at All Times") and Section 240-79 ("Schedule XXIX: Permit Parking) of the East Hampton Town Code.

Adopt Local Law Amending Chapter 75 (Airport) of the Town Code Clarifying Penalties Provisions and Definitions in the Law and Providing for Evaluation of the Effectiveness of Restrictions

WHEREAS, the East Hampton Town Board has considered several local laws to address restrictions on the use of the East Hampton Airport; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local laws have been modified in response to further analysis and public comment; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the previously proposed laws inadvertently omitted a definition of the term "season" because the definition appeared only in a proposal for which the Town Board has decided to defer consideration; and

WHEREAS, it is important that the proposed local laws be enforced effectively but that the penalties not be excessive or disproportionate to the offense; and

WHEREAS, the penalties for violation of Section 75-38 should be only as severe as prudent to discourage violations; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for penalties for violations to be "violations" under New York law rather than "misdemeanors" and also be subject to civil action as appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the entire study, analysis and public outreach process has demonstrated that there exists considerable reliable data on the impacts of the Airport on residents and visitors but the Town can only predict how people will change their behavior in response to the proposed restrictions; and

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that the restrictions remain effective and no more restrictive than necessary to address community noise concerns, it is important for the Town to evaluate the effectiveness of the restrictions following the summer 2015 season; and

WHEREAS that evaluation should reveal valuable information about people's behavior and reaction to the proposed restriction; and

WHEREAS, the Town will consider modifications to the restrictions if warranted based upon the data about the results of the restrictions during the 2015 summer season; and

RESOLVED, said Local Law is hereby adopted to read as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 7 OF 2015 Intro. #7 0f 2015

A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 75 (Airport) of the Town Code clarifying penalties provisions and definitions of the law and providing for evaluation of the effectiveness of restrictions.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION 1. Amendment

Sections 75-38, Airport Use Restrictions, and 75-39, Penalties, of the Code of the Town of East Hampton are hereby amended to state as follows:

§ 75-38 AIRPORT USE RESTRICTIONS:

A. **Definitions**.

. . .

(5) "Season" shall be the months of May, June, July, August and September.

§ 75-39 PENALTIES:

- A. Section 75-34 shall not apply to violations of Section 75-38 and this Section 75-39 shall apply for all violations of Section 75-38. For the purpose of conferring jurisdiction upon courts and judicial officers in general, violations of Section 75-38 shall be deemed violations, and, for such purpose only, all provisions of law relating to violations shall apply to such violations.
- B. Any Use of the Airport by an Individual Aircraft in violation of Section 75-38 shall be punishable by a fine assessed against any person, organization, corporation, group or other entity which holds an ownership interest in such aircraft, as follows:
 - (1) For the first violation by an Individual Aircraft, a fine of not more than \$1,000.
 - (2) For the second violation by an Individual Aircraft, a fine of not more than \$4,000.
 - (3) For the third violation by an Individual Aircraft, a fine of not more than \$10,000.
 - (4) For the fourth violation by an Individual Aircraft, a prohibition on any Use of the Airport by the Individual Aircraft involved in such violation for a period of not more than two years.
- C. Each Use of the Airport by an Individual Aircraft in violation of Section 75-38 shall constitute a separate violation.
- D. In addition, any entity convicted hereunder of not complying with the requirements of Section 75-38 may be subject to a fine of not less than the amount of the actual costs incurred and owed to the Town and not more than an amount equal to twice said actual costs. Should any person, organization, corporation, group or other entity be found in violation of the provisions of Section 75-38 within five years of a previous violation of this chapter, the minimum additional fine shall be not less than \$2000.
- E. In addition to the above penalties, the Town may also maintain a civil action or proceeding in the name of the Town in a court of competent jurisdiction to compel compliance with or to restrain by injunction the violation Section 75-38 by any person, organization, corporation, group or other entity which holds an ownership interest in the Individual Aircraft.
 - (1) If a finding is made by a court of competent jurisdiction that the defendants or any of them has caused, permitted or allowed a violation of Section 75-38, a penalty to be jointly and severally included in the judgment may be awarded at the

discretion of the court in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for each violation that the defendants or any one of them individually caused, permitted or allowed the violation.

SECTION 2. Authority

The Town Board is authorized to establish and promulgate rules and regulations regarding use of the East Hampton Airport pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law §10(1)(ii)(a)(11) and (12) and Town Law §130 and pursuant to its powers as the proprietor of East Hampton Airport under federal statutory and case law and regulations of the Federal Aviation Administration.

SECTION 3. Severability.

If any section or subdivision, paragraph, clause or phrase of this law shall be adjudged invalid, unenforceable, or unconstitutional by any order or judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, or pursuant to any order of any administrative agency having jurisdiction, whether such judgment or order is temporary or permanent, such judgment or order shall not affect the validity of this law as a whole or any part thereof other than the part or provision so adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. Interim Evaluation

The Town shall evaluate the effectiveness of all airport use restrictions set forth in Section 75-38, Airport Use Restrictions, as soon as practical after September 30, 2015. The evaluation shall include assessment of whether the restrictions have been effective in reducing community disturbance and annoyance and of the financial consequences of the restrictions. The results of the evaluation shall be made available to the public and shall be the subject of a public meeting convened by the Town Board. After such public meeting, the Town Board shall consider what modifications, if any, to the restrictions set forth in Section 75-38 are warranted.

SECTION 5. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of East Hampton held a public hearing on May 7, 2015 to consider a local law amending the effective date of section 82-5 (Alcohol Restricted Beach Areas) of Town Code Chapter 82 (Peace and Good Order) in order to restrict alcohol at Indian Wells beach for 2015; and

WHEREAS, after considering the matter, the comments of the public at the time of the hearing, the Town Board believes that the establishment of the subject restriction is in the best interests of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local law is a Type II action pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) 6 NYCRR Part 617.5 and Chapter 128 of the Town Code; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, said Local Law is hereby adopted to read as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 10 OF 2015 Intro. # 12 of 2015

A LOCAL LAW amending the effective date of section 82-5 (Alcohol Restricted Beach Areas) of Town Code Chapter 82 (Peace and Good Order) in order to restrict alcohol at Indian Wells

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION 1. Legislative Intent.

The Town Board of the Town of East Hampton restricted alcohol at Indian Wells within 1,000 feet of the road endings, during the hours of lifeguard protection on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays until September 30, 2014. While the Town Code does provide, in Chapter 82, that alcohol consumption is prohibited in public places, a beach has to be specifically posted to indicate that alcohol is prohibited. Additionally, the Town Board wished to provide the public with adequate notice by codifying the specific bathing beaches, areas, days and hours within which alcohol and alcohol consumption was prohibited. This local law provides that the restriction on alcohol at Indian Wells beach shall be extended for the upcoming summer season until September 30, 2015.

No person, including the owner, shall use or permit to be used any single-family residence for any of the following:

A. Two-family residence. Creation, use or maintenance of a two-family residence as defined herein, except as may be authorized in certain cases by special permit pursuant to the Use Table and Article V. A violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

B. Multifamily occupancy. Occupancy at any time by more than one family, except as permitted by § 255-11-62C(3) and (4) hereof. - F. Fractionalized ownership interests. The creation of cooperative-style ownership, less-than-fee simple ownership or other similar arrangements resulting in proprietary tenancies for one or more persons in the residence, the establishment of interval or time-sharing ownership for any person in all or any part of the residence, or the like. However, this subsection shall not be deemed to preclude the creation of mortgages, liens, easements or other similar interests encumbering the residential property as a whole to secure a loan or for any other legitimate purposes.
- G. Parking. When in use pursuant to § 255-11-62D hereof, parking of vehicles of occupants and their visitors on the street or on any property other than the lot on which the residence is located or parking overnight of more than four vehicles on said lot shall be prohibited. A violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both.

This provision shall not be deemed to prevent the temporary parking of such a vehicle on a residential lot, provided that said vehicle is actively engaged in the delivery of product to the premises on the residential lot on which it is parked.
 - (2) The outdoor storage on a residential lot of up to two boats or any number of such boats used in connection with a home occupation as defined in Article I.
 - (3) Any home occupation or home office use, as the same are defined and permitted herein.
- J. Penalties. PROCEDURE AND POLICY
Regarding Employee eligibility for the Health Plan

This is the Procedure and Policy regarding Employee eligibility for the Health Plan. This Policy is developed so that the Town of East Hampton Employee Benefit Plan will comply with the new rules required by the new Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. We will continue to have our annual Open Enrollment events.

DEFINITIONS

Eligibility? All Employees who are paid an average of 30 hours or more per week are eligible for the Health Plan. This does not include Employees hired for seasonal or temporary work.

Employer ?Town of East Hampton

Health Care Full Time ? (HCFT) Employees who are reasonably expected to be paid 30 hours or more per week, or who were expected to be part time Employees, but during the Measurement Period, were later determined to be Health Care Eligible.

Health Care Part Time ? (HCPT) Employees who are reasonably expected to be paid fewer than 30 hours on average per week.

Health Plan? The Town of East Hampton Employee Benefit Plan

Initial Administrative Period ? Length of time allowed for processing the eligibility paperwork and getting the new Employee enrolled.

Initial Measurement Period? Length of time allowed to evaluate a new Employee?s hours to determine their eligibility for the Health Plan.

Initial Stability Period ? Length of time New Employees are enrolled in the Health Plan after eligibility for coverage is determined they qualify.

Standard Administrative Period ? Length of time allowed for processing the eligibility paperwork and getting the existing Employee enrolled. This will run from the end of the Standard Measurement Period thru December 31. This is an annual time frame and will occur every year.

Standard Measurement Period? Length of time allowed to evaluate an existing Employee?s hours to determine their eligibility for the Health Plan. This time will run from December 1st through the next years to November 30th (12 months). This is an annual time frame and will occur every year.

Standard Stability Period? Length of time existing Employees are enrolled in the Health Plan after it is determined they qualify. This will run for a 12 month period from January 1 until December 31. This is an annual time frame and will occur every year.

Temporary/Seasonal Employee ? This is an Employee who, at the time of hire, has a predetermined end of employment date and the total time in employment will not exceed 120 days.

IMPLEMENTATION

For the purpose of this policy, the Employer will need to make an initial determination for all existing and New Employees.

This determination is if the Employee will be paid an average of 30 hours per week or more on a regular basis.

If the Employer believes the Employee will be paid for 30 hours or more per week on average, the Employer will offer the Employee an opportunity to 1) sign up for one of our available plans with an effective date of January 1, 2015 or 2) waive coverage. Employees in this group will be referred to as Health Care Full Time (HCFT).

If the Employer believes the Employee will be paid less than 30 hours per week on average, the Employer will implement a Measurement Period to determine if the Employee is, or is not, eligible for the Health Plan. Employees in this group will be referred to as Health Care Part Time (HCPT)

For purposes of this policy, we will divide Employees into two groups: Existing Employees as of December 1, 2013 and Employees hired after that date.

WHEREAS, the East Hampton Town Board has considered several local laws to address restrictions on the use of the East Hampton Airport; and

WHEREAS, the penalties for violation of Section 75-38 should be only as severe as prudent to discourage violations; and

A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 75 (Airport) of the Town Code clarifying penalties provisions and definitions of the law and providing for evaluation of the effectiveness of restrictions.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION 1. Amendment

Sections 75-38, Airport Use Restrictions, and 75-39, Penalties, of the Code of the Town of East Hampton are hereby amended to state as follows:

§ 75-38 AIRPORT USE RESTRICTIONS:

A. **Definitions**.

. . .

(5) "Season" shall be the months of May, June, July, August and September.

§ 75-39 PENALTIES:

- A. Section 75-34 shall not apply to violations of Section 75-38 and this Section 75-39 shall apply for all violations of Section 75-38. For the purpose of conferring jurisdiction upon courts and judicial officers in general, violations of Section 75-38 shall be deemed violations, and, for such purpose only, all provisions of law relating to violations shall apply to such violations.
- B. Any Use of the Airport by an Individual Aircraft in violation of Section 75-38 shall be punishable by a fine assessed against any person, organization, corporation, group or other entity which holds an ownership interest in such aircraft, as follows:
 - (1) For the first violation by an Individual Aircraft, a fine of not more than \$1,000.

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- (2) For the second violation by an Individual Aircraft, a fine of not more than \$4,000.
- (3) For the third violation by an Individual Aircraft, a fine of not more than \$10,000.
- (4) For the fourth violation by an Individual Aircraft, a prohibition on any Use of the Airport by the Individual Aircraft involved in such violation for a period of not more than two years.
- C. Each Use of the Airport by an Individual Aircraft in violation of Section 75-38 shall constitute a separate violation.
- D. In addition, any entity convicted hereunder of not complying with the requirements of Section 75-38 may be subject to a fine of not less than the amount of the actual costs incurred and owed to the Town and not more than an amount equal to twice said actual costs. Should any person, organization, corporation, group or other entity be found in violation of the provisions of Section 75-38 within five years of a previous violation of this chapter, the minimum additional fine shall be not less than \$2000.
- E. In addition to the above penalties, the Town may also maintain a civil action or proceeding in the name of the Town in a court of competent jurisdiction to compel compliance with or to restrain by injunction the violation Section 75-38 by any person, organization, corporation, group or other entity which holds an ownership interest in the Individual Aircraft.
 - (1) If a finding is made by a court of competent jurisdiction that the defendants or any of them has caused, permitted or allowed a violation of Section 75-38, a penalty to be jointly and severally included in the judgment may be awarded at the discretion of the court in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for each violation that the defendants or any one of them individually caused, permitted or allowed the violation.

SECTION 2. Authority

The Town Board is authorized to establish and promulgate rules and regulations regarding use of the East Hampton Airport pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law §10(1)(ii)(a)(11) and (12) and Town Law §130 and pursuant to its powers as the proprietor of East Hampton Airport under federal statutory and case law and regulations of the Federal Aviation Administration.

SECTION 3. Severability.

If any section or subdivision, paragraph, clause or phrase of this law shall be adjudged invalid, unenforceable, or unconstitutional by any order or judgment of a court of competent

jurisdiction, or pursuant to any order of any administrative agency having jurisdiction, whether such judgment or order is temporary or permanent, such judgment or order shall not affect the validity of this law as a whole or any part thereof other than the part or provision so adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. Interim Evaluation

The Town shall evaluate the effectiveness of all airport use restrictions set forth in Section 75-38, Airport Use Restrictions, as soon as practical after September 30, 2015. The evaluation shall include assessment of whether the restrictions have been effective in reducing community disturbance and annoyance and of the financial consequences of the restrictions. The results of the evaluation shall be made available to the public and shall be the subject of a public meeting convened by the Town Board. After such public meeting, the Town Board shall consider what modifications, if any, to the restrictions set forth in Section 75-38 are warranted.

SECTION 5. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Adopt Local Law to Amend the Effective Date of Section 82-5 (Alcohol Restricted Beach Areas) of the Town Code to Prohibit Alcohol at Indian Wells Beach, Amagansett for 2015

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of East Hampton held a public hearing on May 7, 2015 to consider a local law amending the effective date of section 82-5 (Alcohol Restricted Beach Areas) of Town Code Chapter 82 (Peace and Good Order) in order to restrict alcohol at Indian Wells beach for 2015; and

WHEREAS, after considering the matter, the comments of the public at the time of the hearing, the Town Board believes that the establishment of the subject restriction is in the best interests of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local law is a Type II action pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) 6 NYCRR Part 617.5 and Chapter 128 of the Town Code; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, said Local Law is hereby adopted to read as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 10 OF 2015 Intro. # 12 of 2015

A LOCAL LAW amending the effective date of section 82-5 (Alcohol Restricted Beach Areas) of Town Code Chapter 82 (Peace and Good Order) in order to restrict alcohol at Indian Wells beach for 2015.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION 1. Legislative Intent.

The Town Board of the Town of East Hampton restricted alcohol at Indian Wells within 1,000 feet of the road endings, during the hours of lifeguard protection on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays until September 30, 2014. While the Town Code does provide, in Chapter 82, that alcohol consumption is prohibited in public places, a beach has to be specifically posted to indicate that alcohol is prohibited. Additionally, the Town Board wished to provide the public with adequate notice by codifying the specific bathing beaches, areas, days and hours within which alcohol and alcohol consumption was prohibited. This local law provides that the restriction on alcohol at Indian Wells beach shall be extended for the upcoming summer season until September 30, 2015.
