In 1938, flying was still a new and exciting experience. **TWA** was then known as **Transcontinental and Western Airlines**. In collaboration with the **Kool-Aid Corporation**, the two companies developed a marketing strategy to introduce their brands to local Chicago families.

Few people flew, but there were plenty of new customers for Kool-Aid. Everyone knew that kids love Kool-Aid. And who buys that? Moms.

As part of their marketing strategy, a cap was sent through the mail to local families who had sent them an empty Kool-Aid package as proof of purchase. A letter from the Kool-Aid corporation accompanied the stylish cap. It read in part, "When you go to the store for your mother, let the grocer see the aviation cap. Tell him you got it in exchange for empty Kool-Aid packages that your mother bought in his store. The grocer will be glad to hear that." It continued, "You might as well give him another hint, too. Tell him you are now collecting more Kool-Aid packages in order to get a real gold-plated Kool-Aid aviation pin."

There were two styles of the cap—a blue one for Pilots and a red one for Air Hostesses. "Also, tell him you're organizing a neighborhood Aviation club and that a lot of people will be asking him for Kool-Aid!

By signing up three friends as part of the club, the advertisement gave each child the opportunity to become a Chief Pilot or Chief Hostess by wearing the newly minted Aviation pin. This pin featured the Transcontinental and Western logo, just like the real thing. A pilot named Captain Fredericks and an air hostess named Mary Carlton represented the face of the airline. I couldn't validate their employment. They were probably fictitious.

SAY! If your Kool-Aid Aviation Cap is a little too big, have your mother make it smaller. Tell her to take in the seam at the back of the Cap...She'll do it in a jiffy!

Along with the pin, Kool-Aid awarded members a nifty "Official CLUB Manual". FOR MEMBERS ONLY is emblazoned on the front. They received an official certificate and a membership card. I am unable to validate the success of this program. However, it sounds remarkably similar to the Ovaltine and local radio ads of the 1930s. They also encouraged young listeners to join and receive a decoder, which they used to decode secret messages sent out during advertisement time.



Remember that Neon TWA Sign on the Headquarters Building???

As many of you know, our museum has been in possession of the TWA "letters" neon sign which appeared on the roof over the East Wing for many years. When the sign was finally removed (and dropped) from the building, our friend **Cooper Weeks**, **Sr.** recovered them and eventually donated them to our museum. While the letters are in rough shape, our hope was to someday recondition them and eventually remount them back on the roof of our building. Well, that day has come!

Volunteer Nancy Sitzmann, with the assistance of John Mays, Operation Manager, has taken the lead on this project to get the sign letters restored and reinstalled. Recently, the museum hosted a meeting with Thomas Cobian of the Neon Gallery. Thomas and a group of experts examined the sign letters and proposed locations for the restored sign on the roof of our building at 10 NW Richards Road. The idea is to run beams across the parapet (the protective wall along the roof) and mounting the letters directly to the platform which would be attached to the beams. Mounting the letters on beams, instead of the roof, would allow a more stable installation and would avoid drilling into the roof. Also, since the parapet is higher than the roof, the platform would not need to be designed as tall as originally thought. It was thought that since we would use the beams that the sign could face directly towards the bridge, which would also allow two smaller neon "Museum" signs to be placed at angles on the sides if we can afford that option. The letters, which are largely intact, can be rehabbed entirely, using newer neon technology which will result in enormous cost savings due to the smaller energy footprint required to illuminate the signs. While we have not yet received a quote for the cost of the project, we estimate the cost to be close to \$20,000. Be on the lookout for future emails and Facebook posts regarding our fundraising campaign to get these treasures back on the roof and illuminated. Our sign will serve as a lasting reminder to all Kansas Citians of the great influence that Trans World Airlines has had on MKC, and the City of Kansas City, Missouri.
