Putting aside the challenges we faced, I wish to focus on the positive, mainly our **Operations Manager, John Mays**.



### From the TWA Lover's Kitchen



Creamy Wild Rice and Chicken Soup

## **History of TWA Flight Attendants**

(Enjoy the first installment of the history of the infamous TWA Flight Attendant Uniforms!)

**WINTER, 1936-1938** Very firm wool sharkskin in charcoal gray. Single breasted jacket with the epaulets banded with red on the shoulders. The skirt was worn with a red silk blouse. The hat was an overseas style. The red and gold wings were worn both on the hat and on the jacket. Stan Herman, a Kansas City tailor, manufactured this uniform.

**SUMMER, 1936-1938** First summer uniform was introduced in the spring of 1936. It was basically the same style as the winter uniform. The fabric was changed to white wool Bedford cord. The jacket had epaulets banded with red on the shoulders and the gold metal wings on the breast pocket. The skirt was originally worn with a long sleeved burgundy sweater blouse that faded onto the white wool and was too hot. It was changed to a white silk blouse with a small burgundy bow tie. TWA paid for the dry cleaning. The hat, an overseas style, had the same embroidered red logo on it. The shoes were plain white oxfords with natural stacked heels.

WINTER, 1939 Designed by Chief Hostess, Gladys Entrekin. It was later sketched by the famed artist George Petty. It was popularly known as the, "Petty Girl", uniform. Winter outfit fabric medium blue charmeen gabardine; the jacket was double breasted with brass blazer type buttons embossed with the TWA logo. The skirt was slightly flared and very graceful. The blouse was of ivory silk, long sleeved with a bishop neckline, and a pleated front. The hat was a new style, high sided with a quilted crown. It featured a cockade of red, gray, and navy ribbon on the side. The sings were worn on the jacket and hat. Accessories included navy pumps and handbag.

**SUMMER, 1939** The Petty Girl summer version. It was white charmeen gabardine, double breasted and was worn with a pale blue silk blouse. It was really identical to the winter version except for color. The shoes were white oxfords.

### Goodbye Lockheed "Connie" 1049G Constellation

### **Flight Simulator**

One of the most popular attractions at our museum has been our Lockheed "Connie" 1049G Constellation flight simulator. The simulator was built specifically for the TWA Museum by the University of Central Missouri-Aviation School and has been a part of our museum since the beginning. Chris Nold, a former TWA Volunteer, developed all of the programming that was utilized in its operation. Guests were able to test their skills at making a takeoff and landing from Kansas City's downtown airport, MKC. Unfortunately, the Sim could only operate on antiquated hardware and software (its operating system was Windows 7). Thus, its continued operation was both costly and limited, as the system, with its current design, could not be upgraded. So, we have made the difficult decision to retire the Connie Sim.

Museum volunteers Matt Larsen, Larry Dingman, Eric Morse and Dennis Claus have been working hard on building a new Sim, which will feature a TWA Boeing 717. In addition, a second Sim, designed specifically for our younger guests, will feature a Cessna 175. The costs of building these Sims was financed by the Museum, and through generous donations from Matt Larsen, Joe and Belinda Hobbs, and Art and Kathy Lujin.
