Letter from Executive Director

We are just finishing up our third year at The White Cane Foundation. Where does the time go? In 2019 we began our journey to bring a new outfit and tennis shoes to the Community Learning Center elementary school kiddos. To date, we have served over 500 of our “bundle of joy” packages to the four schools we are currently at; Belmont, Lakeview, Norwood Park, and Clinton.

This is just the beginning for us and it wouldn't have happened without the huge support that we have received from the Lincoln Community. Thank you, thank you hardly seems enough. Thank you for your donations, thank you for your volunteerism, and finally, thank you for your hearts! You are a part of our growth. Here are some top accomplishments that have been made in 2021.

1. We added Norwood Park and Clinton to our growing list of schools served.
2. We hired our first staff member, Samantha Jacobi.
3. Our “Give to Lincoln Day” totaled over \$35,000.
4. We completed our first fundraising event which included a bottle of complimentary wine.
5. We have two inventory spaces, one at Nebraska Book Company and one at Cornhusker Bank.

We want you to know about the excitement that we see in the faces of these children as they walk in the door. When they walk out the door, their heads are held a little bit higher and they leave with more confidence in their step. That is priceless. In the words of one little girl we met last week, **“these are the prettiest clothes I've ever seen.”**

About the White Cane Foundation

The White Cane Foundation was established in 2019 after an inspiring trip to St. Louis where we witnessed the power of supplying basic needs to school children in high-poverty populations. We looked at Lincoln and were surprised to find the level of need in our schools. Lincoln hides its poverty well, and kids are the first to suffer. The White Cane Foundation was imagined with these needs in mind. To be of service to those kids in need and allow them to take advantage of the wonderful opportunities education provides.



How the White Cane Foundation Works

- We partner with schools where the majority of students live at or below the poverty line.
- A school liaison is selected to help identify students in need and submit weekly orders to The White Cane Foundation.
- Volunteers fill orders and make weekly deliveries to specific schools.
- Volunteers meet one-on-one with students in The White Cane Foundation “store”, a designed space in every school that helps to preserve each child’s privacy and dignity and also contains items for emergency situations.
- Students each receive a new pair of pants and a top, tennis shoes, socks, underwear, hygiene items, and a coat if needed.
- They are encouraged, loved on, and transformed. The pride shows in their eyes as they walk out the door. Our goal is to be a part of every CLC Elementary School in Lincoln.










