Letter from Executive Director

The best things in life take time. You don't get an education in one day and it doesn't stop when that degree is in your hand. The job you are working today is likely the result of the many roles and careers in your rearview. When you become a parent, the reset starts from the very first cry and ends with your very last breath. A simple thank you that is received from one person to another, stems from an effort that was necessary in a moment between two people. Human interaction.

2019 Highlights: Belmont Elementary said "yes" to The White Cane Foundation, and we started our journey. We provided 165 "bundle of joy" (BOJ) packages, which include 2 brand new tops and bottoms, 1 new pair of tennis shoes, 2 pairs of socks and underwear, a new coat if necessary and miscellaneous hygiene items.

2020 Highlights: Covid closes the world. Despite what was occurring, Lakeview School was added. We delivered 250 BOJ packages to our students.

2021 Highlights: Norwood Park and Clinton were added. 350 BOJ packages were gifted to our children.

2022 Highlights: Prescott, McPhee and Everett were added to our list. WCF received \$100,000 from UBT's Big Give, to expand our reach. We presented 475 students BOJ packages with the promise of adding 5 additional schools to our list and purchasing our WCF Mobile Unit.

2023 Highlights: West Lincoln, Hartley, Elliott, Saratoga, Huntington joined our list of schools which rounded WCF out to 12 Community Center Learning Center (CLC) Elementary Schools being served! Our truck was purchased. Over 1,000 smiling children took home their BOJ packages in the spirit of our tag line: New Clothing. Big Smiles. Lasting Impact.

Grand Total To-Date: 2,240 students have now received our BOJ packages, surpassing our early expectations, and fueling our resolve to doing more.

We started this mission of love to give pride and joy to our Title One students so that they can feel better about themselves and do better in school. Our "future generation's" job right now is to discover who they are and what they want to become in this world. The excitement, laughter and pride that is displayed by our children as they walk out the door with their BOJs is the gift that is given between two people at that moment. It is in those precious minutes between a child and their volunteer when the language of connection is on display. Human interaction at its finest. The best things in life take time — time that is captured in the moments that we create for each other. We are excited to see what we can all create in the next five years.

About the White Cane Foundation

The White Cane Foundation was established in 2019 after an inspiring trip to St. Louis, where we witnessed the power of supplying brand-new clothing outfits to school children in Title I schools. We looked at Lincoln and were surprised to find the level of need in our schools. Lincoln hides its poverty well, and kids are the first to suffer. The White Cane Foundation was imagined with these needs in mind. To be of service to kids in need and allow them to take advantage of the wonderful opportunities an education provides.



How the White Cane Foundation Impacts our Local Community

- We partner with Title I elementary schools in Lincoln, NE where the majority of students live below the poverty level. We currently serve 12 of the 18 Title I Schools.
- Each school has an assigned liaison to identify students in need and submits weekly information about the children selected to The White Cane Foundation.
- Volunteers take the information and make weekly deliveries to the school with supplies we provide. They meet one-on-one with students in The White Cane Foundation "store," a designed space in every school where selected children can shop, in a place that provides privacy and dignity in a school-designated area
- Each Student receives two pairs of brand-new pants and two tops, tennis shoes, socks, underwear, hygiene items, and a coat if needed.
- We encourage and love the students while helping them "shop" and see the pride in their eyes as they walk out the door with their new clothes which we call "Bundles of
- Our current goal is to be a part of every Title I Elementary School in Lincoln. We are 2/3 of the way there.






