

Dorinda Jane Oliver

We sadly report the death of **Dorinda Jane Oliver** on 09/21/2024. Dorinda majored in Latin at MHC and received an MBA from Columbia Business School. After a three-year executive training program at Manufacturers Hanover Trust, Dorinda became the first woman to head one of the bank's branches.

By 1973, she was one of the first women vice-presidents at any bank in Manhattan, a position she held sequentially at Chemical Bank, Manufacturers Hanover Trust and Chase Manhattan Corp. She led the Established Wealth Groups within Chemical's and Chase Manhattan's Private Banks.

Following early retirement, Dorinda served on the Board of Directors of the Archaeological Institute of America and traveled throughout the world, reveling in each new culture and adventure. She enjoyed courses in history and literature at NYU and was active in the Dickens Fellowship and Mystery Reading Group at the NYC English Speaking Union.

Dorinda is survived by her sister, Susan Mack-Oliver, and brother, Peter Oliver (Elizabeth), and nieces Catherine and Victoria Oliver.
