I could have had three evening church meetings this week—I decided to go to the Parish Council Annual Meeting with my Contact hat on and left Tina to cover the other meeting. It is a shame so few people attend; it's not surprising that parish counsellors feel most people are apathetic and it is one time, apart from elections, when you can hold people to account. (Speaking of elections, don't forget to take your photo ID with you when you go to vote next week.)

Two of the three church meetings were about open air worship, on Bury Orchard with Churches Together for the Coronation and on Dunstable Downs with the Circuit on 9th July. If people don't want to come inside our

walls to worship, except for special times like Christmas and Easter, we need to go to them. This is the "Church outside the walls" idea. When Martin runs "Beer and Hymns", this is also part of this concept. Most of Jesus' teaching took place in the open, and when John Wesley was prevented from preaching in churches he preached outside. Gwennap Pit is one place he preached on a number of occasions.


HARLINGTON MESSY CHURCH

REVIEW OF THE MONTH

April was a busy month as it included Holy Week and Easter.

Sunday Services continued as usual, except that our Easter Sunday service started at 9.30 am so that Claudia could get to The Square for 11 am. As we had to chase her out after the service, I'm not sure that she made it.

The Good Friday Walk of Witness also took place. The attendance was a bit lower than it has been, and we were unable to perform a full costume drama, and used dramatized readings instead. Next year St. Mary's will be leading on this. However, we may well work together as Churches Together in Harlington in order to make this more effective. This year we also had something in the church during the walk for those who would like to join but couldn't walk.

Messy Church had four families with 7 children and 4 adults present, plus 6 adult helpers for tea and activities. While we would like more, it has recently





felt like it is developing quite a secure attendance, including our usual Zoom attendees. You can see examples of some of what was made in the church, not the food things, though. The Bagel Tombs and the Pastry Puff "eggs" filled

people who are used to that it is hard to realise that, even though I say it, the landline has precedence.

There are many other more significant things in the way we have learned to learn, in the way we see communal singing and so on. There are also the major shifts in ethics around marriage.

"It's good to talk," and perhaps better to listen and share, to support in an uncritical way and to provide opportunities to diverse people.

Prayer

Lord God, help us to embrace diversity not as a chore but as a joy. May we see the world from a variety of views and share with and learn from people not just like us.

REFLECTION

Jeremiah chapter 1 verses 4 to 8: The word of the Lord came to me, saying, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."

"Ah, Sovereign Lord," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am only a child." But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a child.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the Lord.

My third meeting this week was with the Circuit EDI group, reviewing our last event and starting to think about where we go from here. The question was raised about what we were trying to achieve, and I was reminded of our church "Next Steps" from before the pandemic. We said we would like our congregation to reflect our community and our leadership to reflect our (then) congregation. But for that to happen you need to enable and empower people who do not believe they are allowed leadership roles to take them. This will take the form of encouragement, training etc.

We were looking at where we go next, and another area of diversity is in age. When I started work in London, my class leader was 16. It's not allowed now, I'm not sure it was allowed then, really, but she was on the Church Council, as was I at the age of 21.

God often called or spoke through young people. Samuel is another example. Of course God also called or spoke through old people, Simeon and Anna are examples. In fact, God doesn't seem to be concerned with age at all, if the person concerned is prepared to listen to God's call and act on it.

So what can be done to achieve age diversity? This is, as we all know, a far from simple question, but is something to ponder as we all get older. It is often difficult to take on roles that other people have done for years, and it can be very difficult to let someone with little experience take on those roles. We want to pass on all that we learned so that they can avoid our mistakes. We often forget how much things have changed. "Time makes ancient good uncouth" to quote the hymn. But we need to engage in dialogue.

A small example. I have recently been getting many more calls to my mobile, as people in general drop landlines. But, like some other, older people, I do not keep my mobile with me at all times, it lives in my jacket pocket, hung up on the back of the door. For the landline, however, we have 7 cordless handsets scattered around the house; there is always one nearby, and there is an answer phone attached. I don't want to have a mobile in my hand, but for
