Are you looking forward to a holiday?

In July, our Messy Church theme is often "holiday", but not often in the sense that we mean it in the 21st century (or even in the 19th century, really). The bible says nothing about holidays – but it has quite a lot about Holy Days, and also about the need for people to have a break from work.



That is what Holy Days usually were – a break from work. If you were going to spend a week in a carefully constructed camp, while worshipping God, at a central location in your country, rather than living on a farm, or in a village or town, working at whatever you did to make a living, you were definitely having a break from work. The Feast of Tabernacles, or Booths (after the hutlets made of palm branches), happened in late September/early October, after all the harvests were in, and before the ploughing began, whilst all the neighbouring tribes were celebrating their harvests. Yes, there were similarities between the different festivals. Jews and pagans both made sacrifices to their gods, but for the Jews, the tabernacles were a reminder

that God was with them even when they had no harvest to celebrate, that God had brought them safely through the desert to a new and fruitful land.

Three of the Jewish festivals were "pilgrimage festivals", which meant that three times a year, all the men of Judaism would gather in Jerusalem for at least several



days. The story of Jesus getting left behind as a 12 year old at Passover suggests that at least some times, the whole family would go to the festival. Three times a year, therefore, employment would be abandoned for a Holy Day (or several Holy Days) in Jerusalem. A time of refreshment, time to do something different, but always focussed on God.

Are our holidays focussed on God? Is there time for God in our times of refreshment?

If you are having a break this year, I hope you have time to relax, turn off the alarm, and time to meet with God.
