One of the problems with the way we often learn Bible stories is that we learn a series of episodes and don't see the links between them. (For those who have lived in London, it's a bit like the way we use the Underground map without realising just how close some places are, because they are on different lines and seem to be a long way apart.)

Matthew chapter 14 contains three stories, the first of which is rarely considered with the other two. The chapter starts with the death of John the Baptist. It is on hearing this news that Jesus tries to get a bit of solitude, but

the crowd follows him. We know this second story as "The Feeding of the Five Thousand". This is then followed by the story of Jesus walking on the water, and of Peter trying to do the same thing. Three quite different stories which follow one another but which we usually separate. I was looking at the chapter for Messy Church as I wanted the third story.



A few years ago we were set the challenge of reading the Bible in a year. This requires you to read quite large sections of the Bible at a time. This may help you see how things fit together, although it also has the risk of overload. I would, however, suggest that it is a good idea when faced with a passage from the Bible to have a quick look at the bit just before and the bit just after

to help place the passage in its context. Sometimes it is surprising how it all fits together and gives us new understanding of familiar readings.

Another thought from this chapter is the recognition that even Jesus wanted time on his own to think. Also that he didn't always get it, but that he treated those who interrupted with kindness and generosity. In the holiday season many people try to get away for a break. I think that ministers particularly need time to reflect, and not just on holiday. But there is also the question of the way Jesus responds to the crowd. The Feeding of the Five Thousand is

in all four Gospels. In Mark chapter 6, Mark's version of the story, it says, "Jesus had compassion on them because they were like sheep without а shepherd". Do we have compassion on the people who interrupt us?

Now is holiday time, a time for a break even if you don't go away.



Have a rest and help others to have a rest too, but if things happen, remember compassion.
