Hi all,

Advent Sunday is the 3rd December, and for the first 4 Sundays of December and Christmas Day we will be lighting Advent Candles. Advent means "coming".



There are various different associations with the candles. If you look at the Advent hymns in Singing the Faith you will see the one Methodists most often use, although we look at different liturgies each year, which may not always focus on these themes.

On the 1st Sunday in Advent we think about the Second Coming, Jesus' promise to return in glory. It may seem odd to consider this at Christmas, which is about Jesus coming to earth the first time. However, we need to remember the purpose of Christmas, and not just think how sweet it was.

The 2nd Sunday considers the Prophets. If Advent is a time of preparation, it is good to remember how long God had been preparing and telling people, through the prophets, what was going to happen. The fact that the prophets were largely ignored or misunderstood shouldn't prevent us from looking at what they said.

Advent Three is the Sunday we concentrate on John the Baptist. John is the end of Old Testament style prophesy and the signal for Jesus. John is an interesting character. His life must have been focused on the job he was to do, although we know nothing of it between his birth and him appearing in the desert and baptising in the Jewish rite for the washing away of sins. appears briefly, baptises Jesus, points some of his own disciples to Jesus, then is arrested and eventually executed because he has upset the King and his wife.

The 4th Sunday, this year Christmas Eve, is for Mary. Christians remember Mary for her willingness to obey God, at some risk to herself. (I think Joseph gets a bit of a raw deal. He had to accept and obey as well. At some stage after Jesus was 11, Joseph must have died.)

Finally, on Christmas Day we celebrate the coming of Jesus when we light the 5th, central candle.

Advent is a time for preparation and for reflecting on what Christmas is really about. Will you use these themes to get ready for Christmas?
