John Chapter14 Verses 23–28 If anyone loves me, he will keep my word; and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and dwell with him. He who does not love me does not observe my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but it is from the Father who sent me. I have told you these things, while still with you; but the Comforter, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and will remind you of everything I have told you. I leave you peace; I give you my peace. I do not give to you as the world gives. May your heart not be troubled or dismayed. You heard that I said to you: "I am going away and coming back to you"; if you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than me.

Dear brothers and sisters,

Chapter 14 of the Gospel of John begins with the phrase pronounced by Jesus: "do not be troubled in your hearts"; phrase that is also repeated in verse 27. What can this phrase mean for us today? Being aware of the fact that we are in good hands, those of God, and that God does not abandon us in the turbulence of existence, but accompanies us, consoles us, strengthens us, gives us back joy and a future.

This passage also highlights how the God of Jesus Christ is a plural God, who shows himself and approaches us in many ways and with many faces: Father, Son, Spirit. And the Holy Spirit is a kind of red thread that binds all these ways of God coming to us: the Spirit who manifests himself at the moment of Jesus' baptism, the Spirit who descends on the disciples gathered in Jerusalem on the day of Pentecost, the Spirit that accompanies our being together today in the name of Jesus Christ.

It is the same Spirit who provides us with the tools to face the world and be witnesses, in our time, of his death and resurrection. That Spirit who teaches, helps to remember, to love; guard and live his Word, guard it by living and loving.

"In my Father's house there are many mansions", Jesus said in verse 2. "We will come to him and make our home with him", he states in verse 23. The direction, the wind changes... God has many mansions, there he can certainly host and welcome with Him. But here it is stated that there is also the opposite movement: God reaches us and asks us to welcome him, to host him, to make us and our lives his home. He wants to put down roots in our lives and transform them into trees that bear abundant fruit for the entire world and his humanity.

This is the great and beautiful news of this day: we are the dwelling place of God, you are the temple of God, as the apostle Paul would say. No one and none of us is too small or inadequate that we cannot be the home of God. God wants to begin and begin again every day with you, dear brother and sister, with each and every one of us. May his peace, beautiful, strong, lasting, contagious, accompany you in joy and hope. Amen!

by Prince Edward the Duke of Edinburgh.




Our recent Messy Church included 12 children and 5 parents plus 5 helpers. We
