 Wise men

Stories and Activities

1 <u>Angel</u>

You will need: a paper doily, some card, colouring pencils, scissors, glue and/or stapler

Cut the doily in half. Fold one half in half again. Draw the angel's face on a small circle of card, about the size of a milk bottle top. Stick or staple the face to the pointed end of the quarter-size doily (so the angel stands on the frilly edge of the doily). Stick or staple the other half of the doily to the back of the angel, so that the curve of the doily makes the curve of the wings downwards. (See the picture in the pictures file.)

In the Bible, angels are God's messengers. They go from God to the people God wants to do things. In the Christmas story, an angel goes to Mary, to tell her that God wants her to be the mother of Jesus, his son.

When Joseph is worried about this, an angel goes to him in a dream to tell him that Mary is telling the truth, and he, Joseph, should marry her and be dad to the baby she is carrying.

When Jesus is born, an angel tells the shepherds that their long-awaited Messiah has been born, and where they can go to see him. Then lots of angels appear, and sing, like a choir.

<u>**Talk about:**</u> messengers – who might employ them now, whether they are important, what they might tell us.

2 <u>Stable</u>

You will need: A cardboard box, glue, paper and crayons or paints.

Your box needs to be the right size for your figures, if you already have some. If you haven't got figures, try either clothes peg dolls or cardboard tube figures. Cardboard tubes need to be about the size of toilet roll cores. They could be painted, or you could glue on fabric or coloured paper. Either paint/draw faces straight on to the tubes, or use paper then glue it on.

The stable is made by standing the box on it's side, and cutting into it so that you have a sloping roof facing forward, a bit like a lean-to. The flaps on the box can be trimmed to act as an extension to the roof, and the sides will give support. The inside of most boxes is plain, but the outside is often covered in tape or labels, so colour some paper to be like a straw roof, and some more to be like wooden walls and glue it to the outside of the box. If you have some hay, sawdust or straw, you can put it inside, like a stable floor.

Talk about: People today who have nowhere to live, particularly refugees who have had to leave their homes and run away.

3 <u>Sheep</u>

You will need: a paper plate, cotton wool, ribbon or elastic, glue, scissors, pencils to draw the rest of the face, (hole punch)

Use the hole punch (or scissors) to cut two holes on opposite sides of the plate. Cut out eye shapes in line with the holes at the edge so that they line up with your eyes. Draw a nose and mouth below the eyes, in the lower centre of the plate. Spread glue all around the edges of the mask, except over the holes at the side, and stick cotton wool on to finish the sheep's face. Thread elastic from one side of the mask to the other, making it long enough to go round your head, or thread two pieces of ribbon one on each side, long enough to tie at the back.

Sheep were (and are) very important in simple farming cultures. In cold countries they provide wool for clothing for old and young people, they provide milk for drinking and for cheese, and when they get old – or when you have too many male sheep – they provide meat.

Jesus told lots of stories about sheep and shepherds, but when he was born, the angel told the Bethlehem shepherds that the Messiah was born.

<u>**Talk about:**</u> sheep, what they look like, what we use them for, why Jesus used them as illustrations

4 <u>Star</u>

You will need: two pieces of card – or one piece large enough to cut two stars out of it – star template, (see pictures file) scissors, pencils, crayons, glitter, glue, shiny paper or paper shapes

Draw and cut out two copies of the template from card or stiff paper. Cut the line into both stars, and slot them together. Decorate as you would like. Make a hole at the top of the star, and hang it up.

If you go out at night in a dark place, you can see more stars than when you are in a light place. In the days before street lights, when people could see the stars easily, people studied how the stars and planets moved, and wondered if God was trying to tell them things through the movements.

After Jesus was born, some of these people, who were called "Wise Men" or "Magi" came to find Jesus, saying they had been led by a moving star from where they lived, to Bethlehem. They had set out possibly as much as two years earlier, and they had not known where they were going to end up. Traditionally, one wise man was African, one was European, and one was from "the East" – possibly Iraq, Iran or Afghanistan.

<u>Talk about</u>: setting out on a journey, not knowing where you might finish, or how long it might take. Think about how you would prepare for such a journey.

5. Marzipan gifts

You will need: marzipan, icing sugar, food colourings if wanted.

You can colour the marzipan before you make shapes, or you can paint the food colouring on when the shapes are complete. If you do it this way, remember that the food colouring will spread through the marzipan, so the colours will mix.

Traditionally, the **gold gift** comes in a box shape, the **frankincense** can be a tall bottle, like a fancy shaped spaghetti jar, and the **myrrh** comes in a small jar like a fancy honey or cranberry sauce jar.

The wise men brought gifts to the baby Jesus, gifts they believed had meanings to the new baby. They had chosen their gifts to the baby with great care, considering who they thought he was, and what they thought he would do. They brought gold for the King they believed him to be, frankincense for the God they also believed him to be, and myrrh, for his burial.

Talk about: being given presents, or giving presents – do you buy presents specially for people, or just get what seems fashionable at the time? Do you like some of your presents, and not others?

Somebody rich? No, he told some smelly shepherds; smelly shepherds because anybody who spends a lot of time looking after sheep is going to be smelly, because sheep's wool, when it's still on the sheep, smells.
