Our evening service was replaced by a Circuit Advent Carol Service. This was a well attended service, also visible on Zoom and YouTube, preceded by a café craft and meeting time. That led to the excitement of the fire alarm going off in the service. Some lessons learnt there.

Our Family Carol Service, which included the ever popular puppets with 626 and Messy Church children, and readings by members of TFT, was also well attended and enjoyed. The service on 21st December was a Communion Service led by our minister.



The Christmas day service was led by our own local preachers and worship leader, and included an “Open the Book” style reading. This was another well attended service.

626 Club met for the first two weeks in December, including running the Puppet Workshop in preparation for carols. However, we are finding it harder to get parents to put their names on the necessary rota for us to maintain adult numbers for safeguarding.
