MISSION MONTH 24TH MAY—28TH JUNE

This is an invitation to all the churches in the circuit to get involved in **Mission Month**.

Every single church in the circuit is experiencing the same, or some of the same, difficulties that we are all experiencing; aging and shrinking congregations, rising costs and less income, loss of key personnel; a smaller share of a minister's time, a loss of confidence after COVID and an increasingly absent sense of direction – I could go on...

Well, we could dwell on all that negativity, real and imagined or take an opportunity to focus on the positives for a change.

Every church has its own unique setting and mission within that setting. One size of outreach and mission does not fit all churches. Our circuit is large and disparate, ranging from urban to rural, small and cohesive to large and diverse communities and lots of others in between. It is easy to become focussed entirely on your own situation and lose sight of the bigger picture and that is that we are part of a circuit. The purpose of the circuit is to support and encourage churches, but the circuit is the churches, and the circuit can only achieve its purpose if churches support and encourage each other.

We invite each church in the circuit to register one (or more) outreach or mission activity that they will be running during the time period indicated. We will put together a timetable of events and invite others from around the circuit to come along. You should also advertise your event to your own community. It doesn't have to be anything fancy or innovative, it could be as simple as your regular coffee morning or fellowship group, or you could try something new – as long as it is something that you can manage and is something to which you are happy to invite your community, and others from the circuit, to attend.

We hope that this will be seen as an opportunity to go and see what others are doing, learn from each other and forge supportive and encouraging alliances, and most importantly, to recognize the circuit in action.

As a first step you need to start thinking and talking in your churches about what activity, new or existing, you could register to be advertised as part of **Mission Month**. If you have any questions, need ideas or some help in deciding what to do, then you can speak to your Minister, to Roger Owers (Senior Circuit Steward) or myself. Film Club met a week earlier than usual because of the holidays although as this was the first Saturday of the holiday the attendance was still affected.



The 3rd Saturday of the month was Easter Saturday. We held




washing, which we combined with getting ready




Crafternoon Tea met fortnightly through the month, including on Easter Monday.
