How can Atlanta PHS Officers participate in PACE?

Created in 2013, Prevention through Active Community Engagement (PACE), is a chartered advisory group of the Office of the Surgeon General which leverages the expertise of Commissioned Corps officers to provide education about the benefits of prevention in their local communities. PACE grew out of their 2012 development of a strategy to standardize community outreach efforts resulting from their assessment of officer outreach activities at the time. By the next year, the nascent PACE program had become a resource and support network that officers around the country could use to provide health education and promote healthy lifestyles in their local communities. In 2018, PACE became the newest chartered organization in the USPHS Commissioned Corps.

The Surgeon General Education Teams (SGETs), a component of PACE, were established to deliver evidence-based, public health related educational lessons focused on OSG priorities to local communities. SGETs are comprised of active duty USPHS Commissioned Corps officers throughout the ten (10) Health and Human Services (HHS) Regional Areas.

PACE Region 4 coordinators are LCDR Chiazor Eziakor and LT Dana Thompson. Since June 2023, there have been thirteen events. Region 4 PACE events. These events have taken place at back to school events, senior centers, and schools discussing important public health topics such as healthy eating, proper handwashing, healthy dental habits, fall prevention, and mental health. PACE events have the potential to impact thousands of students and adults and can provide important public health information to those in attendance.

Past events held at the Department of Veteran Affairs in May and during the USPHS Science Symposium in June 2024 by R4 PACE. There was a blood drive and a food sorting event at the 2024 USPHS Symposium in Jacksonville, FL, June 22-27.

CRITERIA:

Frontline is a publication for and about COA members and COF donors. It is National COA policy that all officers mentioned in articles, authors of articles and "photo courtesy of " individuals must be current COA members or COF donors; it is imperative that this be confirmed prior to submitting an article to COA; requests for exceptions to this policy should be addressed to COA/F's Executive Director.

FORMAT:

- Submit as an email attachment
- Word format using Calibri, font size 10 (no exceptions)
- Title of article: Century Gothic, font size 14, italic and bold
- Body of article: Calibri, 10 point font
- Review articles for spelling, grammar, sentence flow and variety, truth in numbers, and etc.
- Limit articles to 1,000 words or less
- Include your rank, name, and credentials (if you have them)
- Email or preferred contact information
- Clearance approval by OP/DIVI (if applicable)

Each submitter will receive an email confirming receipt of the article; this is not an acceptance of your article.

PHOTOS:

Submission of photos is encouraged; action photos are preferred. All photos accompanying submissions must be in jpeg file format and attached to the same email submission (*please do not embed photo in word document*); provide a suggested caption, if a caption is desired. Caption sizes should be limited and are subject to editing by COA.
