

Volunteering To Give Back and Contribute to a Better Community by: LT Shifawu Odunsi and LCDR Marie Cetoute

For the Atlanta Commissioned Officers Association (ACOA) operational year of September 2024 to August 2025, United States Public Health Service (USPHS) officers LCDR Marie Cetoute and LT Shifawu Odunsi were elected to co-chair the Community Service Committee (CSC). The co-chairs are motivated to increase the visibility and engagement of USPHS officers in the Atlanta area to give back and make a positive difference in their communities.

Thus far, the CSC has completed two volunteer service activities: a December 2024 event with Trees Atlanta and a November 2024 collaboration with the Black Commissioned Officers Association (BCOAG) to support the 25th Annual Latino Youth Leadership Conference. During the Trees Atlanta volunteer event, a total of 14 officers and community members worked together to clear trails and parklands of invasive plants, thereby increasing usable outdoor space and promoting exercise within the community. In November 2024, three officers served as moderators and presenters for 200 high school students (grades 9-12) from various Georgia schools.

The CSC co-chairs are interested in continuing to offer various volunteer opportunities for USPHS officers in the Atlanta region. These volunteer events may be primarily led by the CSC or conducted in collaboration with other USPHS groups, such as BCOAG and Prevention through Active Community Engagement (PACE). The aim is to serve organizations that cater to underserved populations and promote environmental stewardship.

We encourage you to join the CSC and lead or participate in volunteer events. Meetings occur every third Tuesday of the month from 12:00 p.m. to 12:30 p.m. Eastern Time. By joining the CSC, you would become part of a committed group of officers dedicated to participating in various community service events that positively impact many individuals in the Atlanta region. Sharing is Caring—A Visit to FOREST PARK High School by: CDR Myoshi Meshay Horne and CDR Hai Lien Phung

On October 29, 2024, CDR Hai Lien Phung and CDR Myoshi Meshay Horne visited Forest Park High School in Forest Park, GA to speak to students about PHS and shared their experiences as a PHS pharmacist and Public Health Services Officer, respectively. The student president of the Health Organization Students of America (HOSA) initially invited CDR Phung to present to the club during one of their monthly meetings. Seizing the opportunity to promote PHS visibility and public health, CDR Phung immediately accepted the invitation and recruited CDR Myoshi Horne, to join in the Prevention through Active Community Engagement event.

On the day of the event, there were approximately 40 students in attendance along with their teacher who also serves as the club's advisor. After a warm welcome by the HOSA student president, CDR Phung and CDR Horne began their presentation on public health, a brief overview of USPHS, and defined their roles at the Office of Strategic National Stockpile (SNS). To demonstrate PHS Officers' efforts to promote the Surgeon General's public health initiatives, CDR Phung and CDR Horne also provided the students an overview of the Opioid Overdose Response and Naloxone Training.

At the end of the presentation, the students actively participated in a Q&A session where they had the opportunity to ask questions related to the presentation and career advice. The advisor expressed her appreciation to CDR Phung and CDR Horne for the informative session and was excited to learn about USPHS. Overall, it was a rewarding and inspiring experience! The students were exposed to USPHS as they navigate their high school years and were inspired to start thinking about their career paths.

The Signal and FRONTLINE Publication Guidelines for COA Members

CRITERIA:

Frontline is a publication for and about COA members and COF donors. It is National COA policy that all officers mentioned in articles, authors of articles and "photo courtesy of " individuals must be current COA members or COF donors; it is imperative that this be confirmed prior to submitting an article to COA; requests for exceptions to this policy should be addressed to COA/F's Executive Director.

FORMAT:

- Submit as an email attachment
- Word format using Calibri, font size 10 (no exceptions)
- Title of article: Century Gothic, font size 14, italic and bold
- Body of article: Calibri, 10 point font
- Review articles for spelling, grammar, sentence flow and variety, truth in numbers, and etc.
- Limit articles to 1,000 words or less
- Include your rank, name, and credentials (if you have them)
- Email or preferred contact information
- Clearance approval by OP/DIVI (if applicable)

Each submitter will receive an email confirming receipt of the article; this is not an acceptance of your article.

PHOTOS:

Submission of photos is encouraged; action photos are preferred. All photos accompanying submissions must be in jpeg file format and attached to the same email submission (*please do not embed photo in word document*); provide a suggested caption, if a caption is desired. Caption sizes should be limited and are subject to editing by COA.
