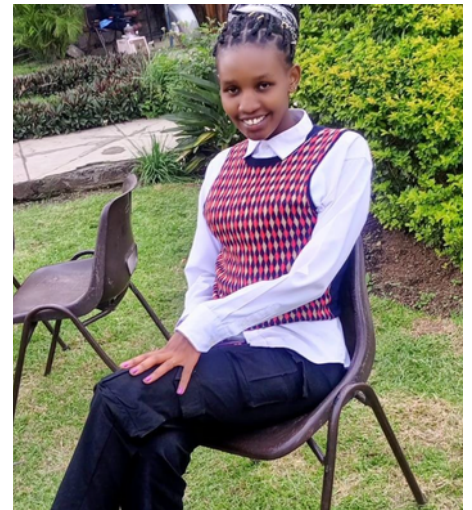

Maen is also a Mount Kenya University student pursuing a Certificate in Perioperative Theatre. She's grateful to all EWK donors who facilitate her education at MKU.

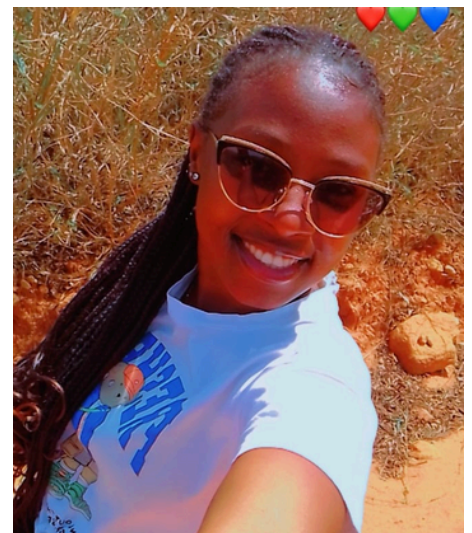
When not in school, Maen is a true fashionista!
