Q1 Impact Updates:

The EWK Foundation is proud to be an active member of the community, making a significant impact through our various initiatives. Our education support program strives to ensure that all students at Juja home in Kenya are settled in school. We are proud to sponsor the education of several students, including the following:

- 14 students from **Ndururumo Primary School**
- 13 students from **Munyaka Primary School**
- 12 students from **Ndururumo Secondary School**
- 6 students from **Mount Kenya University**
- 1 student from **Masinga Institute of Professional Studies**
- 1 student **Queen of Peace Nembu Secondary School**
- 1 student **Nginda Girls Secondary School**

EWK Foundation is also covering the cost of school lunches for junior and secondary school students, and providing a stipend for university students to assist with their accommodation expenses.

Technology:

EWK paid for WIFI services at the Juja children’s home to ease communication with staff and students.

Short/Mid-term needs:

During a visit to Juja Home, Robert Skilton, a friend of EWK, identified inefficiencies in the cooking methods. To reduce fuel costs, he found that combining smokeless fuel with efficiency was more economical and eco-friendlier. Using smokeless fuel also saves an average of 13 trees per ton and results in lower health risks due to reduced smoke emissions. A final report with actionable information is expected.
