

Vision Zero is a traffic safety approach that seeks to eliminate all traffic fatalities and serious injuries. It is based on the idea that traffic deaths and injuries are preventable, and that safety should be the main consideration when making transportation decisions. Vision Zero acknowledges that many factors contribute to safe mobility, including roadway design, speeds, behaviors, technology, and policies, and sets clear goals to achieve the shared goal of zero fatalities and serious injuries.

In September of 2024, members of the US 212 Corridor Safety Task Force/Advisory Board approved and adopted the US Highway 212 Safety Action Plan, Crow Agency to Alzada. This plan focuses on the foundation of the five Es of engineering, education, encouragement, evaluation, and enforcement as a means by which to meet the goal of Vision Zero on the US 212 Corridor.

The US 212 Corridor Safety Task Force/Advisory Board members and the respective agencies, municipalities, and Tribes they represent are committed to the eventual goal of zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries. The Task Force is committed to the goals, objectives and outcomes as set forth in the 2024 US 212 Safety Action Plan and commit to achieving a 70 percent decline in roadway fatalities and serious injuries on US 212 by 2030.
