### The Power of Habits

We are shaped by our habits. I wish this was optional. It is not. Let me explain.

What we do again and again and again is doing something to us. Why? Because at our core we are embodied beings. Let me illustrate with the concept of muscle memory.

When learning a new workout, it's important that we learn the basics, to get work out the right and not hurt ourselves. Overtime, as we engage in this new workout, we develop what is called muscle memory. We are able to execute the workout without even thinking about it. According to the experts, "muscle memory refers to a neurological process that occurs after learning certain motor skills or movement patterns that allows you to remember how to execute these motor skills without conscious effort."

This concept is not just true of working out. We are creatures of habits. We tend to take the same route to and from work. We like our coffee a certain way, etc.

Now, if the above is accurate, that the habits we have formed are forming us, then we need to honestly ask ourselves, do we like who we becoming through these habits of ours? Or do we need new habits to alter who we are really becoming?

Remember, what we do is doing something to us.

### Ramadan

Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, observed by Muslims globally as a month of fasting, prayer, reflection, and community. For faithful adherents, Ramadan is about connecting with God and their communities. Muslims believe that it was during this month Allah (Muslims name for God) gave the Qur'an to the Prophet Muhammad, the founder of Islam, and told him he was in charge of carrying God's message.

Below are some of the practices that Muslims engaged in during Ramadan:

- **Fasting:** The most well-known practice during Ramadan is fasting, which involves abstaining from food and drink from dawn until sunset.
- Prayer: Muslims increase their prayers during Ramadan, with many attending special congregational prayers at night called Taraweeh.
- Quranic recitation: Many Muslims aim to read the entire Quran during Ramadan at least once, or at least a significant portion of it.
- **Charitable giving:** Ramadan is also a time for increased charitable giving, with many Muslims donating to charitable organizations or individuals in need.
- **Breaking the fast:** Muslims typically break their fast communally, with dates and water, followed by a short meal called lftar. This meal is often a communal gathering with family and friends.
- **Increased spiritual reflection:** Many Muslims use Ramadan as a time for increased spiritual reflection, self-improvement, and a deeper connection with God.
- **Eid ul-Fitr:** The end of Ramadan is marked by a "thanksgiving" celebration called Eid ul-Fitr, which includes prayer, food, and festivities.

Now, if we have Muslim Soldiers in our formation who are choosing to observe Ramadan, our moral obligation is to support them and respect their religious observance of Ramadan.

In 2024, Ramadan is expected to begin Monday, March 11, and continue through Wednesday, April 10, enduring with the Eid ul-Fitr celebration.

### **Highlights - Band Ski Trip**




4ID Band Soldiers enjoyed a unit ski trip at Monarch Mountain, sponsored by Warrior Adventure Quest through Outdoor Recreation.






### 2-12FA Change of Responsibility



Joint Firepower Course Training



From 05 to 15 February 2024, 93 Soldiers and Airmen of the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division and FCCO Tenant Units attended the Joint Firepower Course MiTT training course on Fort Carson. Attendance included servicemembers from across the Fires Enterprise ranging from junior enlisted Soldiers (serving as AFATDS and TAIS operators in the JAGIC), Chief Warrant Officers (Division Targeting Officers), to Lieutenants and Captains (BN FSOs, FDOs, and Intelligence officers). After they demonstrated comprehension of the information, they received through two tests and a practical exercise, the service members received graduation certificates and ASI 5U orders to enhance their formations and the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division's warfighting capabilities.

The first week of the course focused on how the Theater Air Ground System (TAGS) manages the integration of joint assets into unified action. Each class detailed how nodes within the TAGS facilitate synchronization of lethal and non-lethal assets, while maintaining a thorough common operating picture for the Joint Force Commander. Students were instructed on what each service provides to the JFC (fixed wing, rotary wing, land based and naval fires) and the types of control set in place to facilitate seamless integration into combat operations. The second week of the course, the students were challenged to put into action all the information received by participating in a three-day practical exercise, in which servicemembers were assigned duty positions to include S3, FSO, ALO, Targeting Officer, and other key staff positions.

# WINTER SAFETY TIPS



## (MONTHLY REMINDER)

### <u>How to Prevent Pipe Bursts in Your Home:</u>

- Allow faucets to drip overnight and when you leave your home for vacations or trips.
- Replace air filters in your furnaces. Recommended by BBC Maintenance, every 30 days. At max, 90 days.
- Do NOT shut off your heat. When not in the home, leave your thermostat at 70 degrees.

### Winter Car Preparation:

- Make sure your car is serviced (i.e. oil change, brakes replaced, tires rotated or replaced, battery checked or replaced)
- Emergency kit in your car:
  - o Water
  - o Food
  - o Blanket
  - o Batteries
  - o Flashlight
  - Snow chains or snow tires
  - o First aid kit
  - Snow brush/ice scraper and shovel
  - o Power bank for cell phones
  - o Jumper cables or portable jump kit
