Our Book Sale opens on Friday, August 21 through Sunday, August 23 and reopens for a second weekend August 28-30! Yes that's right... two book sale weekends in a row!!!

On behalf of the Norfolk Rescue Mission team, we pray that this new season of opening and transformation back into a normal routine once again will give you all a sense of security that God is in control. We as a team will honor and covet your donations and are good stewards of all God's provisions. This is one thing that no pandemic can disturb.
