Matthew 25:35" For I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was Thirsty, and you gave me a drink, I was a stranger, and you welcomed me".

As we welcome new guests into the Mission, we have the opportunity to not only meet their physical needs but to introduce them to our great Savior.

The other day I had a past disciple stop to say hello and let me know how she was doing. She graduated from the New Life Program seven years ago, and thankfully, she is doing so well. She was telling me about the Bible study at her church and how she was remembering all that she had learned in her classes here at the Mission. She began tearing up and explaining that the seeds that were planted in her life are finally maturing. She is now a growing Christian because of her time here in the New Life Program. When she first arrived, she was very lost and was steeped in addiction. I honestly did not think she would stay more than a few days. I am glad to have been proven wrong, when she not only exceeded a few days, but went on to graduate the program.

"Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing so some people have shown hospitality to angels unawares. (Hebrews 13:2) I do not know if we have actually had any angels check in to our dorms lately, but we strive daily to practice Biblical hospitality.

We shine in our dining room ministry where we provide a sweet devotion or reading before lunch and a chapel message before the evening meal. We are so thankful for the resources to continue this ministry. It is because of your faithful and regular donations of food and financial support that we continue day by day. Our numbers have been up and down this past season. We don't always know how many to prepare for, but God always makes it work out.

At the present time our breakfast cooks are requesting donations of instant oatmeal, sausage links and frozen waffles. We are so thankful for anything we receive for our pantry or freezer.
