We want to thank Eugene Makovec, Editor of American Bee Journal and Charles Linder for the opportunity to share this article with our membership. If you recall Charles was our Guest Speaker at Field day 2 years ago, a commercial beekeeper running bees for honey and pollination in the midwest. A good article from an experienced beekeeper.

"By now I am sure most readers have heard of great losses this winter affecting the almonds. Some are hailing it as even bigger than the original CCD. This month, that will be our main discussion. What, where, how and why, and maybe the most important part, what next?? Keep in mind, I write this in mid-February, and it will be a few weeks before you get it. But first, a bit of an update on almonds in general. Last year we saw the demand for colonies drop a bit. Several seasons of tight water supplies and low nut prices really cut into growers' margins. Due to that we saw a lot of acres of older trees being pulled, and in many cases replaced with other crops (pistachios being one). Some will be replaced with younger trees, a few with self-pollinating varieties. Net result, a decrease in the number of hives needed in the last two seasons"
