Reminder!!

This month we will be having the "LCBA Honey Product Spotlight" and April's product is Bee's Wax Cake. You may bring in a 1/2 pound wax cake (8 oz). It will be judged on cleanliness, uniformity of appearance, color, aroma and the absence of cracks and shrinkage.

No labels on the wax, no prizes, one winner, just bragging rights.

During the April meeting the judge will talk about how it was judged and what the qualities that they were looking for. Bring your wax cake to April's meeting and give it to Bren Leiby. She will give it to the judge and we will have the results before the night is done.

Judging criteria:

Color (light yellow-lack of stain, no bleaching)	30 points
Cleanliness (free from dirt, honey impurities)	25 points
Uniform Appearance of entry	15 points
Freedom from cracking, shrinkage and marks	15 points
Aroma & Weight	15 points



LCBA Executive Meeting

March meeting held on March 31, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm.

Denzil St. Clair asked for approval of the February executive minutes, Randy Leiby made a motion to accept the minutes, Gene Gargas seconded, for 5, oppose 0, minutes accepted.

Beginner Classes Wrap Up

Congratulations to everyone completing the 2022 Beginner Beekeeping Classes. We have 105 new beekeepers. Thank you to all the teachers and those who supported the classes.

Future New Business - Fall Class - Introduction to Beekeeping.

John Rose made a motion to reimburse Audrey expenses of \$167.79 (certificates, cookies, coffee etc), seconded by Randy Leiby, for 5, oppose 0, motion passes.

Randy Leiby made a motion to pay Gene Gargas \$25 for the renewal of the State of Ohio Charter, Marilyn Teeple seconded, for 5, oppose 0, motion passed.

Memorial Hive Classes – April 16, 23, 30 & May 7, 10 am. Randy Leiby discussed probable topics: For April 16th - Installing bees; April 23rd – Fist Inspection, checking for the Queen. Weather permitting. Randy Leiby will have information in the newsletter.

Intermediate Class Presentation – April 9 beginning at 10 am – We currently have 37 people signed up for class. John Rose and Randy Leiby will facilitate the class. LCBA members – free; Non-members - \$10.

April 8 Members Meeting – Bee Inspector – Jon Reichel

John Rose will oversee the Smoker Contest – a bag of smoker fuel will be the prize. Anyone interested in taking part in the smoker contest should arrive at 6:45. Wax Contest – bragging rights

World Bee Day May 21 - Sheila St, Claire reports plans are going well; flyers are printed; banners are up at the farm. Opening remarks will be at 10:00 am. John Rose will open hives and provide education starting at 11:00am and on the hour. The **LCBA Booth** will be on Poor Man's Porch. Tri-folds, banners, flyers, Memorial Hive honey, and Cookbooks will be at the LCBA table.
