Brandon will be presenting a discussion on Varroa Treatment

The Not So "Inert Ingredients": Toxicity of Adjuvants in Pesticide Sprays and Benefits of Bee-Safe Adjuvants in Varroa Control

Here's a little bit about Brandon.....

My name is Brandon Shannon and I am a graduate research associate at The Ohio State University. I will be graduating with my master's degree in environmental sciences this Spring and transitioning to the PhD program. I have been beekeeping since 2017 during my undergraduate chemistry degree at the University of Central Florida (UCF), where I was the teaching assistant for the beekeeping course and managed the UCF apiary. Three years later, I got the opportunity to combine my enjoyment of beekeeping with my passion of environmental chemistry by researching with Dr. Reed Johnson while pursuing a degree at Ohio State. My research started by determining toxicities of adjuvants (formulations of "inert ingredients" added to improve pesticide tank mixes) to honey bees. I'm now researching how bee-safe adjuvants can improve miticide formulations for varroa control in honey bee colonies. After completing my PhD, I plan to further my career in academia through honey bee research, teaching, and extension.

Daryl Baker entertained the Lorain Lions Club with beekeeping stories and a few fun facts about bees on March 9 to a reception of 25 interested members.






