Friday, January 14th Member's Meeting

Presentation Title: Honey Bee Pheromones: Theory & Management

A look at the fascinating role that pheromones play in regulating the life and behavior of a colony as well as a discussion about how we could use this information in colony management.

Dave Noble began his professional beekeeping career at OSU's Honey Bee Research Lab in the mid-1990's. He has been training beekeepers and teaching about bees since the early 2000's.

For 7 years Dave was staff apiarist at a nature center in Delaware, OH. Currently Dave runs Red Beard Bees where he continues to refine, develop, and teach his training programs across Ohio and the nation.

Dave employs a bee-centered philosophy to guide his beekeeping, beebreeding, and educational endeavors. He believes that a better understanding of bees creates better beekeepers.

Meeting called to order at 6:50 pm.

Denzil St. Clair asked for approval of the November Executive Minutes, Marilyn Teeple made a motion to accept the minutes, Randy Leiby seconded, for 6, oppose 0, minutes accepted.

Memorial Hive – Audrey Gargas last heard the plaques were with the design group. They should be ready for spring so we can install. Thank you, Garrett Kuhner for helping LCBA with this project.

2022 Fair Rules and book changes – Joan Romick was kind enough to go through the fair and LCBA's fair book rules so we can make sure they give the same entry information. Since we will be selling honey on the Sunday set up day, we will keep registration open till 6 pm. Joan Romick also reviewed our LCBA Sellers rules and changes will be made throughout the document. At this time, we will keep the 2021 Fair Honey Prices the same and review at the July exec meeting once we observe the prices for Medina and Cuyahoga County Fairs. Thank you, Joan Romick for fine tooth combing our rules. The intent to sell forms have been changed to reflect Bren Leiby as Fair Booth Chair. Thank you, Bren Leiby for volunteering for Fair Booth Chair.


