January Speaker - "Varroa Mites", Robert Najjar, President Summit County Beekeepers Association

Robert Najjar is a passionate beekeeper who lives in Richfield Ohio. He has been married to his sweetheart Mervat for over 34 years now. Robert and Mervat have four children together. He is a grandfather to Paxton and two more grandkids on the way. Robert owns and operates a technology company (DIS) that specializes in Cybersecurity and Networking. He started the company in 1992 and currently employs 16 employees.


His journey with bees started with running into a demonstration at the community garden in Richfield when a lady, now his friend, demonstrated how docile and gentle honey bees are. His journey started with one Saskatrez colony. Now, Robert manages 38 colonies. Robert enrolled in the Master Beekeeping program in 2021 at the University of Florida (UF), under Dr. Jamie Ellis' leadership. He became a Master Beekeeper in June of 2023. Robert is currently enrolled in the Craftsman Beekeeping Program at UF and hopes to finish by the end of 2024.

Robert's success rate when it comes to overwintering his colonies is 80%-85%. He attributes this success to his ability to manage the mite population throughout the year. During his presentation, he will go over his approach and the methods used.




