We have two members who are interested in becoming a trustee with the LCBA Executive Committee. We will be voting at our December meeting but here is a preview of our candidates!

I am Denise Vasel. I have been in LCBA since I took Beekeeping classes from LCBA in 2016 Oberlin. I took the classes to get over my fear of bees. That first year I had 1 hive and got a lot of honey from it. I have slowly increased my hives to 7. But over the last 10 years I have had really good years and really bad years. I have learned to make sure I have a good plan for my bees, treatments, harvests, splits, swarms etc. This is necessary! I have learned a lot through the bee club and its members. We have a very good source of information with all of our members. If you have a problem with your bees, just ask someone about it.

An allergic reaction ended Nancy's beekeeping days; however, it did not end her love and interest in promoting the benefits of beekeeping. Nancy has served the club through volunteering and serving as interim trustee since July.

HONEY JUDGES NEEDED:

There is a real need for qualified honey judges in Ohio, especially the northern part of the state. LCBA will offer this course free of charge to any interested party willing to put in the time and effort. The course will take place at Life Church, 1033 Elm St., Grafton, Ohio 44044 on Saturday, January 10, 2026, with an alternative date of January 31, should weather become inclement and inhibit driving.

A \$25.00 refundable fee will be required upon signup, and returned to you after the completion of the class. The class will be limited to a maximum number of ten (10) participants.

During this class you will learn the necessary equipment and their uses; for example, refractometer, polariscope, and Pfund scale. Additionally, LCBA is going to a standardized score card, so we will discuss scoring honey (in various forms), pollen, wax (in various forms) soap, lip balm, and anything else you may find in a standard honey show. There will be follow-up information forthcoming - this is a first notice! 
