

At the heart of the exhibition lies an exploration of the human experience, where each artwork serves as a reflection of the artist's personal journey and connection with their own history of family and place. Whether through the intricate details of a cast plaster sculpture or the serene imagery of the graveyard itself, Smith and Scott-Pillow invite viewers to find solace and inspiration in the stories of those who came before us.

Lucie's practice is rooted in an exploration of the cycles and relationships that characterise the human condition, with a particular focus on memory, empathy and storytelling. Within these interrogations lies a deep fascination with traces and the overlooked.

Through a compulsive process of collecting, reproducing and curating, she brings together symbols that characterise a narrative which are remembered, imagined, or fragmented.



Amy Scott-Pillow

Amy is a multidisciplinary artist exploring social connection and class dyanmics. She has a particular interest in English heritage and historic custom. In past works she has found connection with members of her departed family by crafting echoes of their essence. Amy's work invites contemplation on the intersections of history, memory, and the perpetual dance between the living and the departed.
