

What Do We Cover In Intro to Broadcasting?

Our class is divided into three sections: TV, Radio, and News/Sports. During each section, you complete projects where you get hands-on experience with our state-of-the-art equipment. In addition, we have class discussions and activities on topics in the broadcasting world that affect our students. At the end of the semester, you will complete a culminating project based on your favorite area covered during the semester.

Intro To Broadcasting Project Examples

TV Talk Show: Using our 3-camera live television studio students work together to produce a short talk show. They are able to work both on camera and behind the scenes as a team.

Filmmaking: Students learn the basics of filmmaking including editing on Adobe Premiere Pro. They will produce videos including a commercial, a short scene, and a demonstration.

Live Radio Show: Students will learn all the ins and outs of creating a live radio show for air on WGBK. Roles include host, co-host, engineer, producer, etc. Students get to be live on our WGBK webstream!

Radio/TV Newscast: Students produce, write, edit, and anchor a video news program. They learn about selecting stories and broadcast journalism as well as what it takes technically to produce a show.

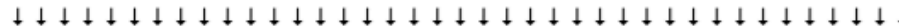

Television Broadcasting

- Be a reporter, anchor or producer of **Spartan News Now (SNN)**
- Create movies and video projects (commercials, music videos, etc.)
- Learn how to anchor/report for a broadcast
- Assist in video production of school events that air GBNbroadcasting.com

Radio Broadcasting

- Host a radio show by yourself or with friends on **WGBK-FM, 88.5 FM**
- Produce content (PSAs, Features, etc.) that will air on WGBK
- Learn how to engineer a broadcast and practice hand-on radio skills
- Participate in the annual Lou Malnati Cancer Research Radiothon every spring

Sports Broadcasting

- Create sports highlights for awards ceremonies
- Anchor and report segments on **The Spartan Report**
- Perform play-by-play and color commentary for GBN athletic contests
- Videotape and produce file footage for use in different projects

Can be taken as a 2nd Semester elective if you take Introduction to Broadcasting during 1st Semester
