Raw Food Blends follow the Prey Model Raw Diet (PMR) and are designed to replicate the diet of a wild canine or feline. Ask about our current available flavors. We are also able to produce customized blends with a 100 lb. minimum order.

Muscle Meat is the main portion of raw feed and should make up 70-80% of a dog's diet depending upon which feed model (PMR or BARF) is selected.

Organ Meats are more densely packed with nutrients and minerals.

RAW PET FOOD FROM YOUR LOCAL BUTCHER

All meat, bones and organs <u>should not</u> be enhanced, seasoned, smoked, or cooked in any way.

A basic guideline indicates your animal should have 80% Muscle Meat, 10% Edible Bones, 5% Liver and 5% Other Secreting Organs. Liver is mandatory in Raw Diets.

Because dogs, cats and ferrets metabolize fat into energy, fat is an essential part of a raw food diet.

Wash your hands, utensils, and work areas after handling raw pet food. Keep raw pet food frozen until ready to use. Always monitor your animal when feeding raw food. Keep raw bones, meat and poultry separate from other foods. Keep raw pet food away from children. Refrigerate leftovers immediately.

All puppies, especially young puppies, should eat total balanced meals (muscle meat, bone, liver, and organs) because they have higher nutrient requirements during their crucial growth period.

Week 1-2	Chicken Muscle & Bone Only
Week 2-3	Red Meat Proteins
Week 3-4	Liver & Other Organs
Week 4	Variety & Balance

2-4 Months	8-10%	3
4-6 Months	6-8%	3
6-8 Months	4-6%	2
8-12 Months	3-4%	2
18 Months & Older	2-3%	1-2

These are general guidelines, not strict rules. See your pet professional for more details.

When adding a new raw food source to your pet's diet, remember to start slowly and gradually increase the amounts until you have reached the required ratio for

your dog. Monitor body conditions and stools to determine if more or less food is needed.

Raw Feeding Tips for Cats

Feed 3 times a day and remove uneaten food after 20 minutes. Multiple meals are healthier, and the sensation of hunger will encourage your cat to try new foods.

Slowly introduce wet food into your cat's dry food diet. Start with small amounts of wet food and gradually increase over time.

Slowly increase wet food and decrease dry food until the cat is only eating canned/wet food.

Mix pea sized raw chunks into the canned/wet food. Be sure to coat the raw food thoroughly with the wet food to help encourage your cat to eat raw food.

Continue to increase the number of raw chunks mixed into wet food. When increasing the raw pieces, slowly increase the size of the chunks.

Once your cat is eating 75% raw chunks in wet food, it is time to switch to total raw meals.

Poultry and Fowl Necks are too dense and too high in bone content for most felines.

Weight bearing bones from poultry, fowl and ruminants create a risk of injury to the cat and should not be served.

Smoked/Cooked bones can splinter when eaten and should not be fed to animals.

Weekly bone servings equal one chicken wing tip and one chicken wingette fed three times a week.
