

In collaboration with the Georgia State University Department of Occupational Therapy, the Cognitive Motor Control Laboratory (http://thecmclab.com/) is recruiting people who have had a stroke and have a weaker arm and hand to participate in a research study. We are trying to learn how training with action observation might help people use their weaker arm and hand to hopefully improve movement.

Our study involves coming into the lab on 1 day, watching videos, and practicing using the weaker arm and hand while we record arm movement and eye gaze. The total time for the study is 1 visit for ~2 hours, for which you will be compensated with a \$100 gift card.

- Stroke survivor
- Mild to moderate weakness in arm and hand from the stroke
- Normal or corrected vision
- Cognitively intact

## **Participant Information:**

- Non-invasive testing will include: eye gaze observation and kinematic data analysis
- Complete 1 session for ~2 hours.
