"Thanksgiving" Romans chapter 1 (ESV)

7 "To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

8 **First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you,** because your faith is proclaimed in all the world. 9 For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you 10 always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you. 11 For I long to see you...

14 I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. 15 So I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome.

16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. 17 For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. 19 For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. 20 For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse. **21 For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him,** but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. 22 Claiming to be wise, they became fools, 23 and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things.

24 Therefore God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, to the dishonoring of their bodies among themselves, 25 because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever! Amen.

26 For this reason God gave them up to dishonorable passions..."



Thankfulness ~ Notes from Sermon Series - Fall 2007 By Pastor Wayne Carson (part 2)

The opposite of thankfulness is grumbling. Grumbling inwardly comes so easy to us that we often don't realize we are doing it. What does grumbling mean? To grumble means to murmur or mutter in discontent, to complain sullenly, to sulk, to be moody, cheerless, mournful and dark. To murmur is to utter low, indistinct sounds, or to growl inwardly. It means you have a complaint. The dictionary defines complaining as accusing. And guess who you are accusing? The Proprietor of the planet Earth, i.e. God, of mismanaging the details of your day, or life. If not God, then whom?

Thanks and praise release the love, peace, joy, power, and fragrance of Heaven into our lives. Grumbling and discontent block the love, peace, joy, power, and fragrance of Heaven. Thanking God for negative things gets easier. The results of our reactions are cumulative. With each "thank you, Lord" it becomes easier to believe. But each time we allow unbelief, pessimism, or grumbling to deny God's presence and love in a difficult situation, the negative results pile up, accumulate, and it becomes increasingly difficult to be willing to exercise any faith at all. The more we grumble, the more defeated we feel. The more defeated we feel, then we grumble more. Instead of going from victory to victory, we go from victimhood to victimhood. Many little thankless grumbles add up to overwhelming mountain of depression.

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:4-7
