What are cognitive biases?





They are pattern errors in thinking.

They are formed when people process information through their personal.

They or others shape the way they make decisions societal lens.



Over 200 biases in five categories

Attention
Memory
Judgment
Reasoning
Personality





Illusory Truth Effect

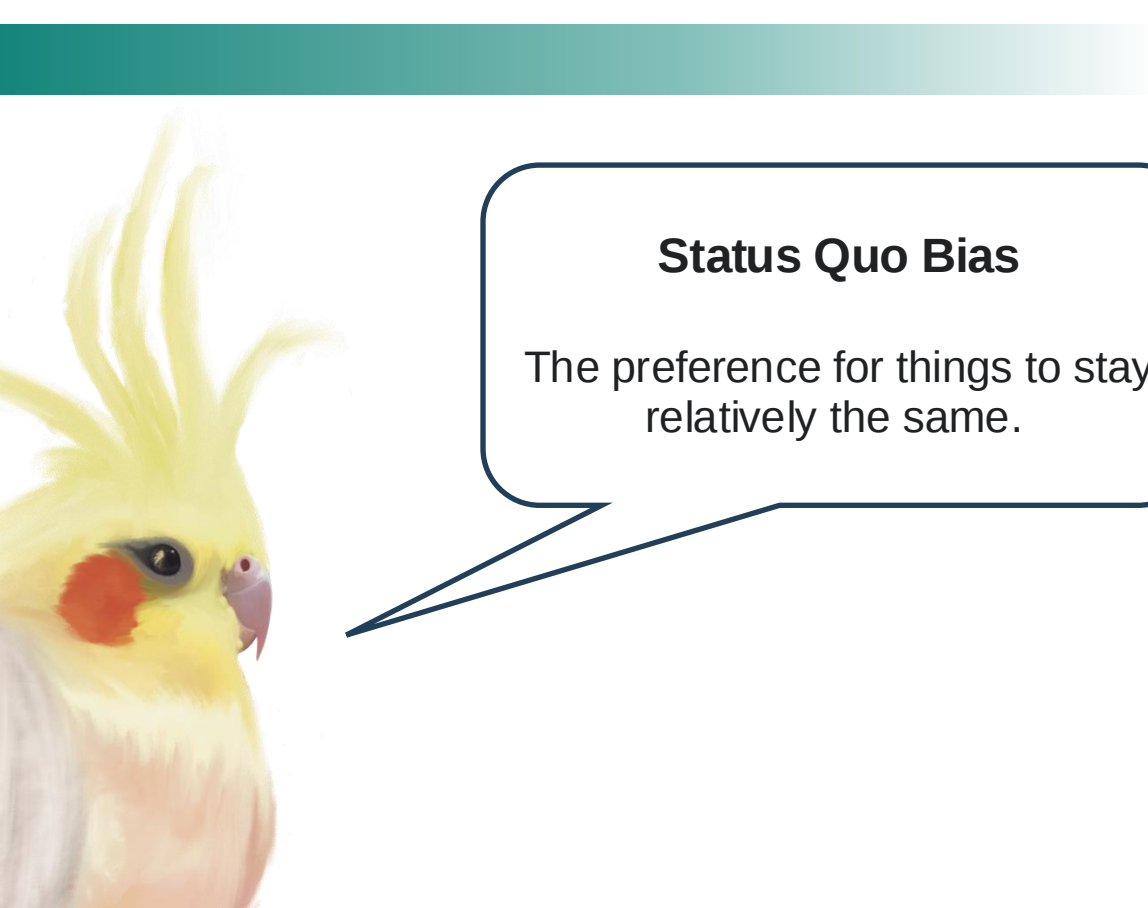
A tendency to believe something to be true if it's been stated multiple times.



Optimism Bias

A tendency to be overly optimistic and underestimating the probability of undesirable outcomes.





Status Quo Bias

The preference for things to stay relatively the same.



Bandwagon Effect

A tendency to do things because everyone else does them.

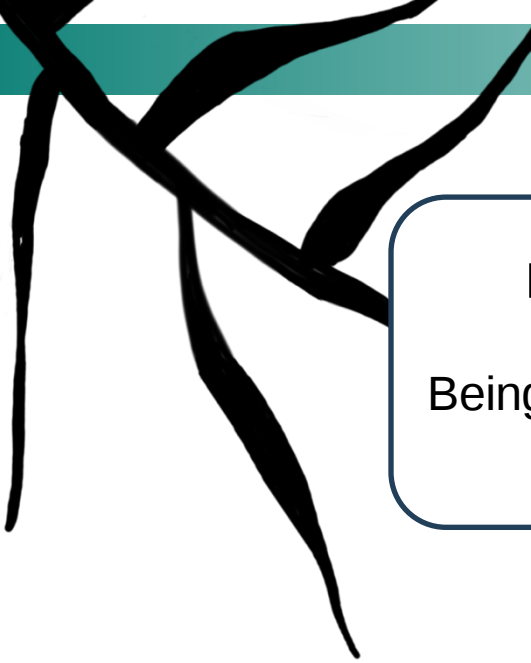




Ostrich Effect

Ignoring an obvious negative situation.

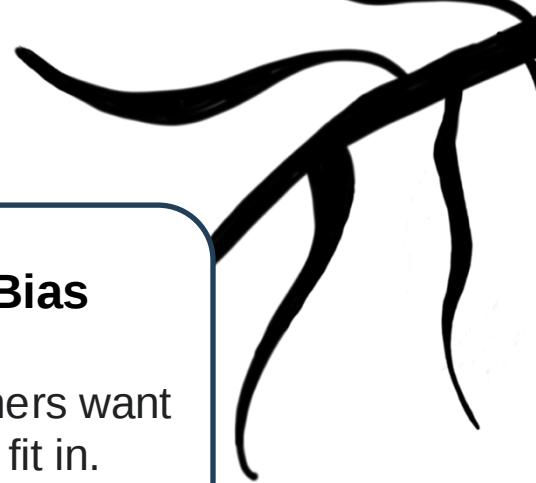

Law of Instrument

Being overly reliant on tools or methods.





Social Desirability Bias

When people say what others want them to say in order to fit in.

Dunning-Krueger Effect

Unskilled individuals tend to overestimate their own ability and experts tend to underestimate.

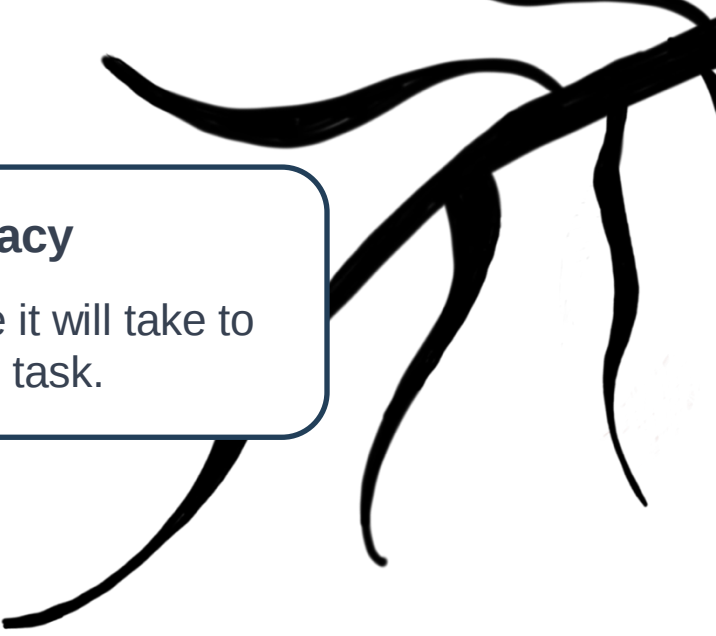
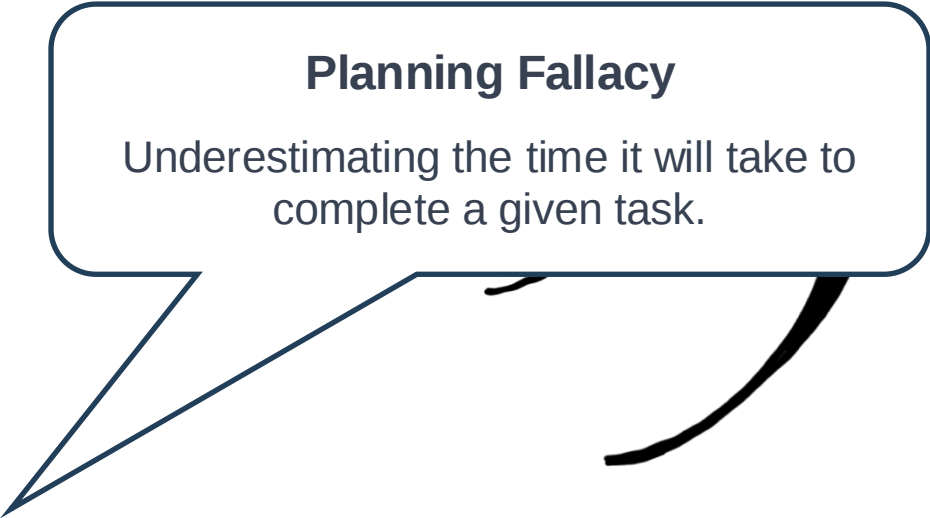




Sunk Cost Fallacy

Continuing to pay for something because money has been spent, even when evidence says otherwise.





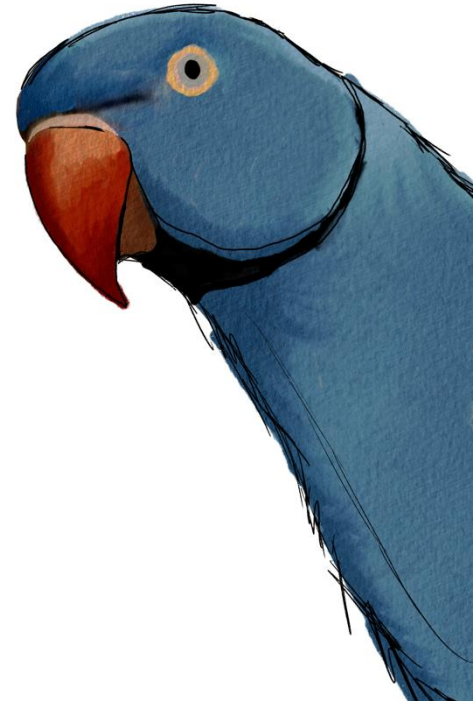
Planning Fallacy

Underestimating the time it will take to complete a given task.



Blind Spot Bias

Recognition of bias in others while
unable to recognize in themselves.





Authority Bias

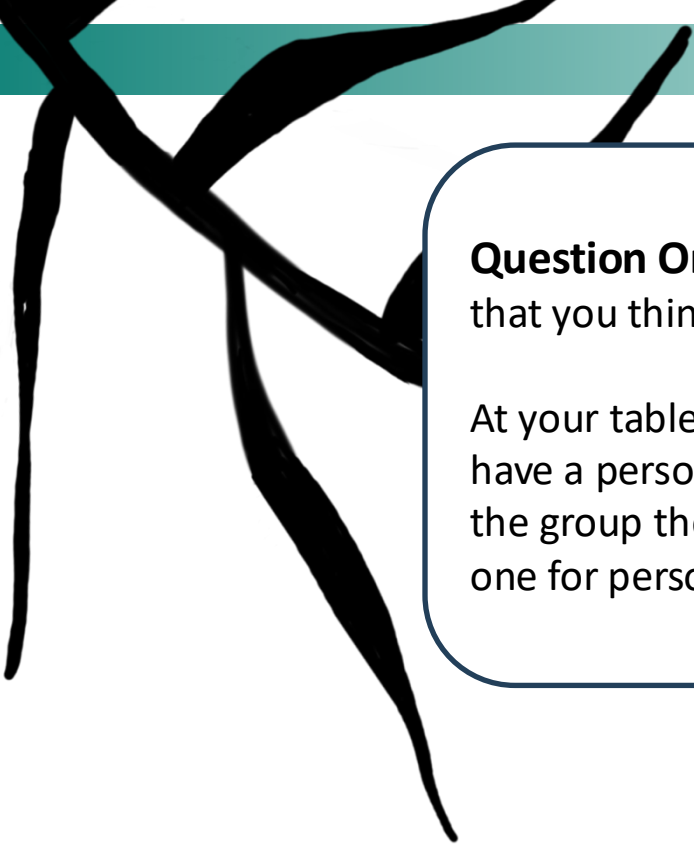
Attributing accuracy to the opinion of an authority figure.
