Annual Membership Meeting Minutes February 27, 2014

The meeting was called to order at Belmont Country Club at 6:10PM by President Strickland.

A roll call was made with self-introductions by the members. The attached attendance list reflects those in attendance and proxies received. A quorum was reached with proxies received.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the minutes of the March 27, 2013 annual membership meeting was approved as mailed.

Mr. Gerosa spoke about the replacement of the power pole in the well compound. Mr. Gerosa explained that the pole was rotted below ground and was replaced at a cost of approximately \$2,800 last April.

The annual financial statement attached to these minutes was reviewed by Secretary/Treasurer Emigh. The largest expense and biggest increase from the previous year was for electricity used to pump water from the well to the members' households.

Vice President Bigelow explained the recent drought declaration made by the Governor and the need to conserve 20% of current usage. With hand out, he described the current usage to be well above state averages. A general discussion ensued with the members about usage and various methods which could be implemented to reduce usage. Mr. Bigelow addressed a test conducted in early February with Belmont Country Club to determine if their irrigation lines were connected to the BWC distribution lines. A connection would explain the high household usage calculations. The test proved there was no interconnection.

Mr. Bigelow discussed again the need to install individual water meters at the service entrance of all homes by 2025. President Strickland explained that it was the board's position to wait and see if the membership can voluntarily reduce usage to more reasonable numbers. If household usage does not decline, or if the state choses to accelerate the installation of meters, a Board decision will be made on meter installation timing. Current meter installation costs were also discussed.

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Mr. Gerosa spoke about the aging pump motor and the need to replace or rebuild it in the near future.

Mr. Emigh announced the Board approval of assessment increase of \$100 per household per year for the 2014-15 fiscal year. The board is contemplating another increase of the same amount for the 2015-16 fiscal year.

A general discussion ensued among the members about building reserves to finance larger projects or finance them through assessments. There was no general consensus as to the preferred method of financing.



BWC Annual Meeting Roundtable Discussion Points


We began looking at our overall usage of water in the system which has averaged 31,345,000 gallons per year for the past two years. That's an average of 65,303 gallons per month per household. Using the <u>Association of California Water Agencies Water Use Calculator</u>, a typical household with two people, watering 10,000 to 20,000 square feet of lawn daily, using no water saving devices would use 31,908 gallons per month. The average California household consumption is 23,275 gallons per month. The BWC household used for the past two years, 105% more than a calculated household and 181% more than an average California household. Our well is now pumping from a depth of about 70 feet, down from 55 feet a few years ago. We still have quite a few feet before we have problems, but we need to reduce usage now before we need to drill deeper.




Please help your board of directors identify waste where possible. We need to conserve water wherever we can. You can go to the website listed above and calculate your usage to see where your personal usage fits into the total BWC usage. We would like you to share your findings and thoughts on water conversation. If we all work together now, we may forestall mandated conservation or mandatory metering which may be much harder to deal with than a participatory plan.

Usage is 181% of CDPH normal standards, we will be on the hit list for water consumption.

It is difficult to conserve what can't be measured.
