#1: Is your plow control illuminated?

Check solenoid and battery connections

- Follow black wire with red stripe (12 gauge) and check to make sure it is connected to ignitionlook at 12v supply fuse in fuse panel
- Follow small red wire (12 gauge) to battery and check connection and 10amp (red) fuse

Plow raises slowly or not at all, plow angles slowly or not at all

#1: Check hydraulic-fluid level- it should be within 3/4 inch of top of the reservoir when lowered in V position Is your reservoir full of fluid?



Check connections to make sure everything is tight, check batteryespecially if you have 2 batteries! (a low/dead battery will cause plow to work poorly) No,

#1: Check to see if you have a broken hydraulic hose Is there a broken hose?

We have hoses in stock that we can swap out for you! Make sure you know the make and model of your plow <u>before</u> you call! • Is your hydraulic fluid overfilled? It should be 3/4 inch from the top of the reservoir when the plow is lowered in the V- position



Fluid will spray out if it is overfilled

Check to see if any of the hose fittings are loose

Plow lights are not working, dim, or flickering

#1: Make sure to look for plow/truck light switch and make sure it's switched to plow!

Light switch is on plow and it's still not working?



Look at the connections- are they damaged, loose, or corroded? Try to clean/tighten connections. Check relays to make sure they are not broken/corroded.
