I think we could all agree that at some point in our lives we experience something that completely changes everything we were taught to believe about life. For me that event occurred just over five years ago. I was a single, stay at home mom of two girls. I had a great condo in Urbandale, a bachelor's degree in business management, and in my opinion, I was living my idea of the perfect life. Unfortunately, that all changed when I lost custody of my children

in a DHS case. Unable to effectively cope I turned to drugs and things went from bad to worse quickly. Within months I found myself living homeless on the streets

addicted to meth. I was arrested in 2018 in Polk County. I saw Chaplain Jerry several times. He prayed with and helped me reconnect with my Mom. The next 5 years of my life revolved around warrants, jail stays, and failed attempts in treatment centers. The last time I was on the run for 2 years, and exhausted. I remember thinking that this was all my life was ever going to be, and I had officially lost hope. Thankfully, God had other plans. I got in a car, we got pulled over, and I was arrested. I was sentenced to Prison, and it

was the best thing that could have happened to me. I spent 7 months in Mitchellville, and during that time I was able to look at my life. I began to notice so many ways that God had been working, but I had been too wrapped up in my personal feelings to notice. I was born and raised Catholic and although I always believed in God I didn't have a real relationship with Him. I used my time in prison to change that. I read my Bible, went to Bible study, and even got baptized again. I realized the night that I got into a car and was arrested was when I surrendered to God. My whole perspective began to shift. After my time in prison, I went to the Beacon. I remember many times walking past The Beacon when I was homeless wishing I had the courage to walk in and ask for help, but my feelings of guilt and shame were so strong I couldn't bring myself to do it. I had no idea what to expect when I walked in those doors as I had gotten so used to being defined by the stigmas and stereotypes associated with drug addicts, a seven-digit inmate number, and the label felon. What I found was treatment with love, dignity and respect. They told me I could

give my heart to Jesus and accept Him as my Savior. I did that and was treated like the new person I was despite the poor choices I had made. Most importantly they believed in me until I was strong enough to believe in myself. Today I am happy to report that my family is back in my life. I own my home, and I work for the Beacon as an administrative assistant. The last 5 years of my life have not only been the hardest that I have lived so far, but also the most important. It took losing everything to bring me closer to the Lord, and now with each new blessing I appreciate the hard times I went through even more. I experienced miracles and learned lessons that I could have gotten no other way. I am proud to be living proof that Jesus changes everything!
